

Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Today marks the end of the Liturgical Season of Christmas.

Originally, the baptism of Jesus was included in the celebration of the Epiphany. The Epiphany originally celebrated three events in Jesus' life: the visit of the mined at the worlding freest of

magi, Jesus' baptism, and the miracle at the wedding feast of Cana. All three were understood to be manifestations of the Son of God. This ancient understanding of the Epiphany is remembered in the antiphon for the Canticle of Mary in Evening Prayer II for the Solemnity of the Epiphany in the Liturgy of the Hours:

> Three mysteries mark this holy day: today the star leads the Magi to the infant Christ; today water is changed into wine for the wedding feast; today Christ wills to be baptized by John in the river Jordan to bring us salvation.

Although the visit by the Magi had become almost the sole focus of the Epiphany for a very long time, it was only after the Octave Day of the Epiphany was abolished as a feast in 1955 (?) that a feast titled the "Commemoration of the Baptism of our Lord" was established. It was originally on January 13, which formerly had been the Octave Day of the Epiphany which itself was focused on the baptism of Jesus. The baptism of Jesus marked the beginning of his public ministry.

This weekend at the 8:30 am Mass, we are celebrating the Rite of Enrollment for our 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} grade candidates for First Eucharist. Please pray for these children and their parents as they begin preparation for both First Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

Tomorrow begins Week 1 of Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ in all its fullness. During Ordinary Time, green is the liturgical color, the color of hope.

Although New Year's Day has passed, I would ask everyone who ever parks behind the rectory to make one resolution for the year. Please do not block the garage doors that are marked "Do Not Block." During the fall, Fr. Patrick was not here on weekends because he was teaching at St. Meinrad. From now on, he will be here most weekends. Please be considerate if you park behind the rectory.

Finally, today is the 24th anniversary of the death of Archbishop O'Meara. Please remember him in your prayers today.


