Dear Parish Family,

In times past, the Church celebrated its major feast with octaves, eight days of celebration. The only octaves remaining in the Church today are the octaves of Easter and Christmas.

In earlier times, today was called Low Sunday or *Dominica in Albis* (Sunday in White). It was called Low Sunday in contrast to Easter or High Sunday. It was called Sunday in White because the neophytes, the newly baptized, put aside the white robes they had received at their baptism and had worn throughout the week and returned to ordinary clothes. The white robes were a symbol of newness of life and innocence.

Blessed Pope John Paul II re-titled the Second Sunday of Easter as Sunday of Divine Mercy. Each year the Gospel recounts the story of Jesus' institution of the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Easter Sunday evening.

On Monday, April 8, the Church will celebrate the transferred Solemnity of the Annunciation. This Solemnity celebrates the Archangel Gabriel's announcement to Mary that she has been chosen by God to be the mother of his Son and Mary's acceptance of that invitation. To me it is interesting that having just celebrated Easter, we already are looking forward to Christmas. The usual date of the Solemnity is March 25, exactly nine months before Christmas.

We want to welcome Msgr. Paul Koetter, pastor of Holy Spirit Parish and Dean of the East Deanery, as the celebrant and homilist for our 6 p.m. Mass this Sunday evening.

With spring coming around, we are in need of a parishioner to step up and coordinate our green thumb ministry. Please see the information elsewhere in the bulletin and volunteer if possible.

Finally, as I look back on the Triduum, I continue to be grateful for all our Liturgical ministries and ministers. In a special way, I want to commend once more our Music Ministers and the Art and Environment Committee. I have never been in a parish where the music for the Triduum has been so beautiful and so appropriate. I have never been in a parish where the church has been decorated so beautifully.






