Dear Parish Family,

Today is World Marriage Day. Today we congratulate and pray for all married couples and all those preparing for marriage.

Monday, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, is the World Day of the Sick. In his letter instituting the Word Day of the Sick, Blessed Pope John Paul II wrote that the day would be "a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and of reminding everyone to see in his sick brother or sister the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising, achieved the salvation of mankind" (Letter Instituting the World Day of the Sick, 13 May 1992, n. 3).

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, we will celebrate Mass and distribute ashes at 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Also, every Friday evening during Lent, there will be Stations of the Cross and Communion at 5:30 p.m.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. The law of abstinence requires Catholics 14 years of age and older to abstain from eating meat. The law of fasting requires Catholic from the age of eighteen until their fifty-ninth birthday to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church defines fasting as one main meal a day and two smaller meals which if added together would not be larger than the main meal.

We will join parishioners of Our Lady of Lourdes and St. Bernadette for a Lenten Penance Service on Monday, March 4, at 7 p.m. at Our Lady of Lourdes. The Sacrament of Reconciliation not only forgives our sins but also empowers us to live better lives.

Besides ashes on Ash Wednesday, we will be giving a small remembrance to everyone who comes to Mass on the First Sunday of Lent, February 16 and 17. The theme of this year's Lenten reflection booklet is *Seeking God in all Things: Lenten Prayer with Thomas Merton.* The remembrance will have "Seeking God in all Things" with a picture of the crucified Christ on the front and Isaiah 55:6 on the back: "Seek the LORD while he may be found, call upon him while he is near." Please be here to get yours, to begin the journey, and to recommit yourself to seek the Lord this Lent.

Lent, however, is not all penance. One of our Lenten highlights is our weekly Fish Fry each and every Friday during Lent except Good Friday. Serving begins at 4:30 p.m. and continues until 7:30 p.m. I want to encourage everyone to attend and to invite family, friends, and neighbors to attend. The Fish Fry is a wonderful opportunity for parishioners, family, friends, and neighbors to socialize.

Each year the Fish Fry earns the parish approximately \$9,000. This money is included as ordinary income in our annual budget. In the final analysis, the success of the fish fry depends on the numbers who attend. The more people who attend each week, the more successful the fish fry will be. I am profoundly grateful to Mary Martha Costello and all her dedicated workers who work every week to make the Fish Fry possible. I am also grateful to those organizations and individuals who volunteer to help on one or more Fridays.

"10 Things We Want You to Know About the Catholic Faith" Town-Hall Meeting

As part of the Year of Faith, the Archdiocese is inviting each parishioner to contribute to the writing of a pastoral resource called "10 Things We Want You to Know About the Catholic Faith." As one of the component of this process, each parish is asked to hold a town-hall meeting to surface 10 Things We Want You to Know About the Catholic Faith." Our parish meeting will be **Monday, February 11, at 7:00 p.m.** in the St. Patrick Room in the parish center. Mark Erdosy will facilitate the meeting. Please join us and be a part of this Year of Faith process!



On Sunday, February 17 at the 8:30 a.m. Mass we will celebrate the Rite of Sending and Call for Continuing Conversion for those who have been faithfully attending RCIA. At this rite "we" as a community and with their sponsors, we will acknowledge the

spiritual progress the catechumens and candidates have made, express approval of their election or recognition, and send them forth to our bishop with assurance of the parish's care and support. We will celebrate the Rite of Election at S.S. Peter and Paul Cathedral that afternoon at 2 p.m. This Rite marks a key moment. For the catechumens (unbaptized), this Rite signifies that they have been called by Christ and want to enter the Catholic Church. From this point they are no longer catechumens but are called the "elect." They have chosen to enter into the final period of preparation for initiation, and are called by the bishop to the holy mysteries to be celebrated at Easter. For all those who have been baptized (candidates) we call them to "continuing conversion," and their intention to be fully initiated and share in the Eucharist is recognized at the Rite of Election. The bishop will address our candidates by say, "Hear the Lord's call to conversion and be faithful to your baptismal covenant." (RCIA 454) Together with the elect, the candidates are thereby moved by this Rite into the period of intense spiritual preparation.




