Dear Parish Family,

During Lent, our Elect enter into intense preparation for their entry into the Church on Holy Saturday. This year we have thirteen adults and two children (6 baptisms and 9 candidates) who will be fully initiated into the Church at the Easter Vigil.

Last weekend, this weekend, and next weekend, we celebrate the Scrutinies with our Elect. Last Sunday's Scrutiny took place at the Saturday evening Mass; today's will take place at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, and next weekend's will take place at the 6::00 p.m. The purpose of each of the scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect" and "to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good" (RCIA, 141). At the First Scrutiny, the former catechumens were anointed with the Oil of Catechumens and all the Elect were presented with the Ten Commandments. At the Second Scrutiny, they will be presented with the Nicene Creed, and at the Third Scrutiny, they will be presented with the Lord's Prayer.

Holy Week is only two weeks away. Please make plans to attend the Holy Week Services. Palm Sunday Masses will be at their regular times. The Holy Thursday and Good Friday Liturgies will be at 7:00 p.m. The Holy Saturday Easter Vigil will be at 8:00 p.m. Please consider attending as many of these Liturgies as possible. Holy Week is the holiest week of the year for Catholics.

As we await the election of a new Pope, I would suggest the following prayer:

Lord God, you are our eternal shepherd and guide. In your mercy, grant your Church a shepherd who will walk in your ways and whose watchful care will bring us your blessing.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.




