Dear Parish Family,

Today begins the second week of Lent. Every year the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Lent tells the story of the Transfiguration. Congratulations also to Emma Gedig, a sixth grader at Little Flower Catholic School. She won the design contest for the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tourney t-shirts. Congratulating Emma, we also have to congratulate Kathy Laham, Emma's art teacher here at Little Flower.


Thanks to all who returned their stewardship intention cards this weekend. If you did not remember to bring your card, please bring it next weekend and place it in the collection basket.
