### Dear Parish Family,

The parish staff and I want to wish all mothers a blessed and happy Mothers' Day. One of the distinguishing qualities of good mothers is their willingness to sacrifice for their children. Today is your day. Please celebrate and enjoy!

Thank you to the Little Flower Ladies Club for their \$5,000.00 contribution to the parish. On Thursday, May 2, the Little Flower Ladies Club presented me

with an oversized check for \$5,000.00 as their contribution to the parish general funds. Although their principal financial responsibility is to raise funds to decorate the Church and to provide and maintain vestments and linens, every year they make a sizeable contribution to the parish. This year the Ladies Club had new leadership, added activities, and changed some of their fund raising. Even with all the changes, they were able to contribute the same amount they contributed last year. As I have said before, it never ceases to amaze me how much money so few women are able to raise! It is only possible because of their parish pride, determination, and hard work. Once again, thank you, Ladies.

Fr. John Riedinger, our third pastor, was born on May 15, 1882. At a time when most priests were ordained in their early 20's, Fr. John was 42 when he was ordained in 1924. He became pastor of Little Flower on January 24, 1942 and remained as pastor until May 16, 1966. During his pastorate, Little Flower grew to be the largest parish in the Archdiocese with over 5.000 parishioners. Likewise, during his pastorate, many young men and women heard the call to become sisters, priests, and brothers. Fr. John was a builder. He built the convent, the rectory, the garage, two additions to the school, and the church and converted the old church into the gym. In fact, the steeple was placed on the church on May 15, 1962, Fr. John's 80<sup>th</sup> birthday. On Wednesday, in gratitude for all he did for Little Flower Parish, please remember him in your prayers.

When I was in 6<sup>th</sup> grade, all the school children collected money for the new church to present to Fr. John on his birthday. I was chosen to present the money our class raised. Each of us had to give a little speech. In my speech, I used the phrase "your church." He stopped me and said "**our** church." That lesson has always stayed with me. Little Flower is your parish far more than mine!


