Dear Parish Family,

Fr. Dave called with good news Sunday evening. After a PET scan, his doctor said his tumor is significantly reduced. He will probably begin six to seven weeks of radiation this week. He continues to receive physical therapy several times a week. He said his legs are getting stronger, and he is walking more.

At the September Parish Council meeting, the Council decided by consensus to make the entire Little Flower campus smoke free as of January 1, 2013. If smoking is allowed on LF property, a new state ordinance requires signs to be placed at all Little Flower building entrances and exits stating that smoking is not allowed within eight (8) feet of doors. Most smoking at Little Flower usually takes place at the gym and cafeteria entrances during sporting events involving children. The Council, therefore, thought making the entire campus smoke free was the right thing to do. We hope all smokers will understand.

This Thursday, November 22, is Thanksgiving Day! Our Thanksgiving Day Mass will be at 9:00 a.m. There will be no other Masses or Communion Services on Thursday. Little Flower School will anticipate the celebration of Thanksgiving with an all-school Mass on Wednesday at 8:30 a.m.

We all have much for which to be grateful. The two best ways to give thanks for all our blessings on Thanksgiving Day are to celebrate Eucharist as a family and then to spend quality time with our family.

There will be a collection at the Thanksgiving Day Mass to benefit the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Because of the tough economic times, our St. Vincent de Paul Society will be stretched thinner than ever with more people in need and possibly fewer donations.

Because of Thanksgiving, the parish offices will be closed on Thursday and Friday, November 22 and 23.

Finally, next Sunday, November 25, is the Solemnity of Christ the King, the final Sunday in this Church year. Next weekend we will commission all of our Liturgical ministers except Eucharistic Ministers. These include lectors, servers, music ministers, greeters, ushers, and arts and environment ministers.
