Dear Parish Family,

This weekend is our first Christ Renews His Parish Men's Weekend. We welcome Fr. George Menke, S.J., who will be the celebrant and homilist at the 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Masses.

Next weekend we will celebrate the Feast of St. Therese at all Masses. Our Annual Parish Appreciation Dinner will take place in Duffey Hall next Saturday after the 5:00 p.m. Mass. At that time, our Steward of the Year will be announced. All are invited and encouraged to attend.

On Saturday, I concelebrated the funeral of Bob Kiley at St. Pius X. Bob, Class of 1949, was one of our outstanding alumni. Prior to the funeral, his wife Lois told me how much Little Flower and his years at Little Flower meant to Bob. For those of my generation, WIFE changed radio in Indianapolis. Bob became the President and General Manager of WIFE at the age of 29. In his homily, Fr. Jim Farrell made the point that Bob's faith was formed in his family and by the Sisters of St. Francis at Little Flower. He also emphasized that Bob was very blessed in his family and career and very generously shared his blessings with others. For example, he initiated and led the first Annual Fund for Little Flower back in 1997 that helped make the computer lab possible. For the last several years, there has been a scholarship at Little Flower in his honor funded by his son Scott.

In the course of his homily, Fr. Jim also talked about Sunday Eucharist. He mentioned that Bob came to Sunday Eucharist each week to be fed, to be fed at the table of God's Word and at the table of the Eucharist. It was because he continued to be fed at Sunday Liturgy that he was able to continue to share his blessings so generously with others.

In light of Connected the Spirit, the words of Pope Francis concerning changing times are apt:

"The defining aspect of this change of epoch is that things are no longer in their place. Our previous ways of explaining the world and relationships, good and bad, no longer appears to work. The way in which we locate ourselves in history has changed. Things we thought would never happen, or that we never thought we would see, we are experiencing now, and we dare not even imagine the future. That which appeared normal to us - family, the Church, society and the world – will probably no longer seem that way. We cannot simply wait for what we are experiencing to pass, under the illusion that things will return to being how they were before."

Last Sunday, commenting on the parable of the Prodigal Son, the Holy Father spoke about judging others:

"The danger is that we presume we are right, and so judge others", continued the Pope. "We also judge God, as we think He should punish sinners and condemn them to death, instead of forgiving them. This way we risk remaining outside our Father's house, like the elder brother in the parable, who instead of rejoicing in his brother's return, is angry with his father for welcoming him and celebrating. If there is no mercy in our hearts, if we do not experience the joy of forgiveness, we are not in communion with God, even if we observe all the commandments, because it is love that saves, not the simple observance of rules. It is in love for God and for our neighbour that the commandments are fulfilled."
