Dear Parish Family,

Jim Farrell '63, my classmate, for accepting my invitation to preach at the Reunion Mass.

Thanks to all who contributed for this year's Halloween Party and all

worked to make this year's Halloween Party a success. Our Halloween Party is not only for our parishioners and our school students. It is for all the children in the neighborhood. As I mentioned at Mass last Sunday, the Halloween Party is one way in which we reach out to the neighborhood by providing a safe, secure, and enjoyable environment to celebrate Halloween. Eventually each deanery was asked to send seven representatives to an Archdiocesan gathering still focused on a discussion of "10 Things We Want You to Know About the Catholic Faith."

Input from all parish, deanery and Archdiocesan gatherings was then compiled to create a pastoral resource—"Catholic Faith: 10 Things We Want You to Know"—that is designed to be a practical tool for our local evangelization efforts. On Tuesday, I presented copies to our RCIA. A copy is included in today's bulletin. I hope you will take the time to read it. It is only one page long, but it is a good summary of what we Catholics should want to know about ourselves and what we should want others to know about us. Thanks to all who participated at any stage of the process.


