Dear Parish Family,

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity runs from Saturday, January 18, to Saturday, January 25, the Feast of

the Saint Paul, the Apostle. This year's theme is: "Is Christ Divided?" This was St. Paul's provocative question to the Corinthians when there were divisions within the Christian community in Corinth (I Corinthians 1:13). As we are all painfully aware, the Church of Christ is still divided, and there are even serious divisions within the Catholic Church. During this week, we want to pray for true Christian unity.

Monday our nation celebrates the Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. **Both our parish office and our school will be closed in honor of Dr. King**. According to Wikipedia, President Ronald Reagan signed the bill creating a federal holiday to honor King on November 2, 1983. The bill was proposed by Representative Katie Hall of Indiana. The holiday was observed for the first time on January 20, 1986.

Wednesday, the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision *Roe v Wade* legalizing abortion throughout the United States, all dioceses of the United States celebrate a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. On this day let us all pray that the good seed of the Gospel of Life may take root in our land and grow to the glory of God.

Next Sunday begins Catholic Schools Week. Our annual school open house will be next Sunday from 12 noon until 2 p.m. All parishioners are invited to see the good things happening in our school. We especially want to invite all those who have young children.

Finally, some of you having read or heard about the violence in South Sudan have asked about Fr. Mike Barton. On Friday, January 10, I asked Fr. Brian Quigley, the mission director for the Comboni Missionaries, if he had heard anything about Fr. Mike's safety. He said that Fr. Mike is in the Juba Archdiocese, which is peaceful now. Some of the violence started in Juba and spread to other regions. Currently there is only a little fighting in some towns in that region. He said he had heard from Fr. Mike just a couple of days before I spoke with him. Fr. Mike is fine as are all their other missionaries. However, because the region is unsafe, please continue to pray for Fr. Mike and the other missionaries working in South Sudan.
