

Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. 

Today's Readings (3rd Sunday of Lent) First Reading: Exodus 17:3-7 Second Reading: Romans 5: 1-2, 5-8 Gosepl: John 4:5-42

Symbol: Large glass of water

Thoughts: We, like the woman at the well, have things we want to hide from the world. There is no hiding from God. Jesus knew everything about the woman, yet did not shun her, like our world shuns people they consider sinful. Ask for the "water" you need to be the "you" God created you to be.

Practice: Reach outside your usual circle to someone you might usually overlook. Speak to them. Invite them. Be the water of refreshing acceptance to them—the same water Jesus offered the woman.

Our next planning meeting is Monday, March 24, at 7 p.m. in the Parish Center.


