SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 10:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Those of us who remember the pre-Vatican II Liturgy may remember that from this Sunday until the *Gloria* during the Easter Vigil all the crosses, statues, and other images were covered with purple cloths.

This Friday is our last Lenten Fish Fry. Please come and encourage everyone you know to come so that we may reach our goal. Also, as I noted in a previous bulletin, this is Tom and Mary Martha Costello's last year to chair the fish fries. If the fish fries are going to continue, we need someone who accept the role of chair. Any volunteers?

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. For Christians, and especially for Catholics, Holy Week is the most sacred week of the year.

- ❖ On Palm Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem.
- ❖ On Holy Thursday, we celebrate his Last Supper with his disciples during which he instituted the sacraments of Eucharist and Priesthood.
- ❖ On Good Friday, we commemorate his Passion and Death.
- ❖ Finally, on Holy Saturday, we celebrate his triumphant resurrection from the dead and celebrate the sacraments of initiation with our Elect.

There is no better way for us to enter into the mystery of Jesus' dying and rising than through celebrating the Triduum as a parish family. Therefore, I would strongly encourage you to celebrate these three days with our Little Flower faith community. Please note the schedule for Holy Week and mark your calendars.

Also, we are asking that no activities conflict with Holy Week services and activities. This would include 5:30 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. on Holy Thursday, and from Noon until the end of Good Friday.

Also, please note that this Saturday, April 12, will be the last scheduled confessions before Easter. Confessions will be from 3:45-4:30 p.m. There will be **no** confessions on Holy Saturday, April 19.

Next Sunday, Palm Sunday, we will invite all children from toddlers to 5th graders to join in the procession around the church carrying palms. Please encourage your children to participate.

Finally, in the last few weeks, two Oldenburg Franciscans died who had ties with either Little Flower or Scecina. Sister Laurita Kroger died on March 9. She was 99 years old and had been a Sister of St. Francis for almost 78 years. She taught at Scecina from 1954-1960. Sr. Teresa Carol Van Compennolle died on March 25. She had requested that I celebrate her funeral, which was held on Friday, March 28. Sister was 89 years old and had been a Sister of St. Francis for 72½ years. She taught at Little Flower from 1965-1967. She would often say, "I am TC [Teresa Carol] VC [Van Compennolle] from KC [Kansas City] and loved by JC [Jesus Christ]!" Their memorial letters may be found at http://oldenburgfranciscans.org/reflections_remembrance.asp. Sister Teresa Carol was a classmate of Sr. Lavonne Long, who asked me to extend her greetings to all her friends here at Little Flower.

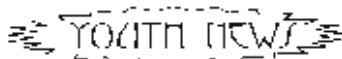
