Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. St. Christopher parish had one of the best depictions of the Holy Family I have seen. Joseph is dressed in work clothes with a tool belt around his waist with Mary, holding the infant Jesus, leaning against him.

Today we want to pray for all families that they will model themselves after the Holy Family. However, with all the violence in the world, we also want to pray for the human family that we all see ourselves as children of the same God and, therefore, brothers and sisters of one

another. Finally, we want to the pray for Church in this intermediate time between the two Synods on the Family that as a Church God's Spirit will help us find better ways to minister to families. Pope Francis has also announced that the theme of the 7th World Meeting of Families which will take place from September 22-27 in Philadelphia will be "Love is our mission: the family fully alive."

Thursday is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, a Holyday of Obligation. Masses will be Wednesday evening at 6:00 p.m. and Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m. It has also been designated as a Day of Prayer for World Justice and Peace. Of course, January 1 is also New Year's Day. The parish office will be closed on Thursday, January 1.

The theme of this year's Day of Prayer for World Justice and Peace is "Slaves no more, but brothers and sisters." The Holy Father wrote:

Today, as the result of a growth in our awareness, slavery, seen as a crime against humanity, has been formally abolished throughout the world. The right of each person not to be kept in a state of slavery or servitude has been recognised in international law as inviolable.

Yet, even though the international community has adopted numerous agreements aimed at ending slavery in all its forms, and has launched various strategies to combat this phenomenon, millions of people today — children, women and men of all ages — are deprived of freedom and are forced to live in conditions akin to slavery.

As the year draws to a close and a new year dawns, I once again want to thank our parish staff for everything they do throughout the year. I want to thank our school staff for their commitment to providing a Catholic school education to our students. I want to thank you for all of your support this past year through your stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. Finally, on a personal note, I would like to thank all of you for your Christmas cards and gifts. I am serious when I tell you that you are unbelievably generous and affirming.

Finally, the entire parish staff and I want to wish you a blessed New Year. In the Old Testament Book of Numbers [6:24-26], God prescribed the blessing with which Aaron and his descendants would bless the Israelites. This blessing is particularly appropriate at the beginning of the New Year:

The LORD bless you and keep you!
The LORD let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you!
The LORD look upon you kindly and give you peace!


