Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Dear Parish Family,

If you were here at Little Flower for Easter, you heard our wonderful announcement that as of Saturday, April 4, we had exceeded our \$800,000 capital campaign goal.

This was an amazing accomplishment considering that our pledge cards were first mailed about eight weeks prior to Easter. Words simply cannot express my gratitude to our approximately 500 donors. Our next goal is to accomplish this significant work this summer.

I have to confess that when the goal was proposed, I really wondered if it would be possible to achieve it. However, once I came to understand that we could reach our goal if 400 donors each gave \$2,000, I knew it was not only possible but probable.

At the same time, I am still in wonder and awe at the generosity of everyone who pledged or contributed. At no point during the campaign did I feel that I or we needed to "sell" the project. Everyone who pledged or contributed with whom I visited or spoke was already committed. I could also tell that almost all our donors saw their gift as giving back to God and/or paying forward what had been given to them.

In a special way, I want to thank Tom Costello for spearheading the campaign. We all know how many responsibilities he has and the long hours he works. By taking responsibility for this campaign, he saved us the thousands of dollars we would have paid for a consultant. I hope you will express your gratitude to him.

To all of you and to Tom, William Shakespeare in Twelfth Night captures my feelings best:

"I can no other answer make but thanks, And thanks, and ever thanks..."

If you have not yet been able to participate in this campaign, we still can use your help. Although we have built money into our project budget for unforeseen circumstances, we never know what we might experience in a building as old as ours. Any excess funds will be held in reserve to cover any unusual situations which may arise. Also, since the entire project cost will likely exceed \$1.1 million dollars, our project budget included the use of parish reserves to accomplish the project. Therefore, money raised in excess of our goal will be used to help us reduce the amount of parish reserves that may need to be used. In that way, parish reserves will continue to be available for future needs! Consequently, we will certainly continue to accept donations and pledges even though we have reached our goal. If you have not already done so, please return your pledge cards in the collection, via U.S. Mail, or to the Parish Center. Finally, special thanks to the Parish Life Commission who hosted the Soup and Bread dinner before the Holy Thursday Liturgy. Special thanks to Anna Marie Guttieriez who prepared the delicious soup.


