

Information about Lent from Fr. Bob

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, we will celebrate Mass and distribute ashes at 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Also, every Friday evening during Lent, there will be Stations of the Cross and Communion at 5:30 p.m.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. The law of abstinence requires Catholics 14 years of age and older to abstain from eating meat. The law of fasting requires Catholic from the age of eighteen until their fifty-ninth birthday to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church defines fasting as one main meal a day and two smaller meals which if added together would not be larger than the main meal.

We have included as an insert in today's bulletin the *Bona Opera* or Lenten Good Works. The insert is meant to be cut into two parts. We invite each person in your home to complete the *Bona Opera*. For households of more than two people, extra copies are available at the doors of church. Please return them either on Ash Wednesday or the First Sunday of Lent. They will be placed in the Ark of the Covenant and then burned on Holy Saturday in the new fire.

Besides ashes on Ash Wednesday, we will be giving a small remembrance to everyone who comes to Mass on the First Sunday of Lent, February 21-22. This year's Lenten remembrance will be a small fish with the word Jesus on the front and John 1:14 on the back: "The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory." Please be here to get yours which will serve as a reminder of God's infinite love for us.

Our Lenten Penance Service will be Thursday, March 5, at 7 p.m. at Our Lady of Lourdes. In addition, extra opportunities for individual confession are being made available in each of the parishes throughout the Archdiocese on both Wednesday, March 4, and Wednesday, March 18, from 6:30-8:00 pm. Also, all five Sundays of March there will a bulletin insert on the Rite of Penance.


