## Dear Parish Family,

Many thanks to those parishioners who are serving on the Capital Campaign Leadership Team. I hope that their work will bear great fruit in the weeks to come. A special thanks to all who have already returned their pledge cards. We hope to have as many cards as possible returned by the end of February so we will know where we stand and can begin follow up.

This year's Lenten remembrance is a fish with "Jesus" on one side and John 1:14 on the other: "The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory." The fish was an ancient Christian symbol for Christ. The Greek word for fish was  $IX\Theta Y\Sigma$  (Ichthus). According to Wikipedia,

**ΙΧΘΥΣ** (Ichthus) is an <u>acronym/acrostic</u> ... for "Ἰησοῦς **Χ**ριστός, **Θ**εοῦ **Y**iός, **Σ**ωτήρ", (Iēsous **Ch**ristos, **Th**eou **Y**ios, **S**ōtēr), which translates into English as "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Saviour."

During Lent, our RCIA catechumens, candidates, and *confirmandi* begin their final preparation for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist which they will receive at the Easter Vigil Liturgy. This Sunday at the 8:30 a.m. Mass we celebrate the Rite of Sending. We, as a community, send them to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election this Sunday afternoon at 2 p.m. At the Rite of Election, on the basis of the testimony of their sponsors and catechists and on the reaffirmation of the intention of the catechumens and candidates themselves, Archbishop Tobin will declare them ready to take part in the sacraments of initiation.

Last Sunday, we prayed for Fr. Noah Casey, the pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes. In August 2013, he had serious cancer surgery. His cancer has reappeared, and he will have surgery this Wednesday, February 25. Please pray for him.

Also, because of his surgery, our Lenten Penance Service in conjunction with Our Lady of Lourdes will be here on Thursday, March 5, at 7 p.m. instead of at Our Lady of Lourdes.


