



#### Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Today we celebrate our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. In the former Sacramentary, there was a beautiful alternate opening prayer for today's Solemnity:

"Lord Jesus Christ, we worship you living among us in the sacrament of your body and blood. May we offer to our Father in heaven a solemn pledge of undivided love. May we offer to our brothers and sisters a life poured out in loving service of that kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy

Spirit, one God, forever and ever.'

As they say, **Summerfest 2015** is in the books. Despite the deluge on Saturday evening and the cool, cloudy day on Sunday, the festival was a success! Although the rain on Saturday evening hurt us financially, I feel worse for all of you who worked so hard to make the festival successful.

- Thank you to all who worked so hard to make the festival a success. Almost everyone in the parish does his or her part to make the festival successful. I am especially grateful to the volunteers who are here throughout the entire festival from set-up to clean-up.
- Thank you to all our sponsors and to all those who donate goods and services for the Silent Auction. Once again this year, we especially thank our friends at the Steer-In for providing the beef and noodles dinner Saturday evening.
- Special thanks go to the Festival Committee for their advance work and their leadership during the festival.
- There are no adequate words to thank Tom Costello. Because of the many responsibilities of the festival, before, during, and after Summerfest, he works incredibly long hours. More than any other one individual, he deserves credit for the success of the festival.

As many of you know, pastors are appointed for a term of six years and can be reappointed for one additional term of six years. In July, I will have completed two terms. However, when a priest reaches a certain age, he is eligible to remain in his parish until retirement. If you read last week's *Criterion*, you know that Archbishop Tobin has reappointed me pastor of St. Little Flower until I reach the age of retirement, which will be July 1, 2020. I am grateful to the Archbishop for permitting me to remain at Little Flower.

Please note the announcement concerning next weekend's collection to support our seminarians. In his letter concerning the collection, Archbishop Tobin wrote,

At this point in time, we are blessed with 23 men studying for the priesthood; 13 of them are in their final years of seminary formation

and study. We hope to add 4 or 5 men to this number for next year. The average cost per student for educational expenses is \$35,000 per

year. The United Catholic Appeal and endowments cover 75% of these expenses, so the Archdiocese depends upon this second

collection to raise the remaining 25%. All donations to this collection will go directly toward the payment of these expenses.

Please remember Fr. Noah Casey, the pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes, and the parishioners of Our Lady of Lourdes in your prayers. Doctors have informed him that any further treatment of his cancers would have an extremely small chance of success and would have serious side effects. Therefore, he has chosen to forego any further treatment of the cancer, opting instead to pursue a path of palliative (comfort) care that will ensure a maximum amount of relief from the pain now and as the cancer runs its course.

Finally, on May 12, 2015, the Pew Research Center issued the first report from 2014 U.S. Religious Landscape Study. According to the report, "as the Millennial generation [those between the ages of 18 and 33] enters adulthood, its members display much lower levels of religious affiliation, including less connection with Christian churches, than older generations."

I know a non-Catholic couple whose church will probably have to close because of loss of members through death coupled with its inability to attract and retain young people and their families. I believe it was Archbishop O'Meara who would frequently make the point that today's young people are not just the Church of tomorrow but also the Church of today!

As parish and as individual parishioners, we need to do everything possible to welcome and affirm the young people in our parish who attend Sunday Eucharist, especially those who participate in liturgical ministries such as members of our youth choir, Eucharistic Ministers, and servers. They are a blessing to our parish. The last thing we want to do is to make them feel unwelcome!

Even non-parishioners notice our young people. For example, one of the carnival workers told one of our parishioners that although he works other Catholic festivals, when they come to Little Flower, it is as though they step into another world where young people are respectful and respect their parents.
