Dear Parish Family,

Little Flower School opened on Monday, August 16. However, our pre-school students did not start until this past Monday, August 24. Several people have asked how many students we have this year. Our opening enrollment was 266.

One of the distinguishing qualities of Little Flower School is its emphasis on Fine Arts. This past week we celebrated the funeral of Ed Axsom. When Fr. Robert Borchertmeyer asked Teresa Eckrich to start a school band, Ed, a longtime music educator and band director, provided Teresa with invaluable assistance in starting the band. Please pray for him and his family.

In my homily last Sunday, I asked parents to think about who or what besides themselves are influencing their children. After the 5:00 p.m. Mass, I went out to dinner with one of my friends. She is the mother of two teenage children. She told me that one of the things she tries to do with her children is to encourage them to propose solutions when there are problems. As she put it, most people can name or identify problems. Fewer people are able to name and identify solutions. I thought this was a great parenting tip.

Thursday is the feast of St. Gregory the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church. Among other things, Pope Gregory was noted for liturgical reform. Two weeks ago, we celebrated the feast of Pope St. Pius X, who was Pope from 1903 to 1914. He was noted for liturgical reform at the beginning of the 20^{th} century.

One of his reforms was lowering the age of First Communion from approximately 14 to 7. I made my First Communion in first grade; today our students make First Communion in second grade. Because he believed very much in power of God's grace and because he believed that the Eucharist was grace giving, he wanted children to be able to receive the Eucharist during their formative years. If we really believe that the Eucharist is grace giving, Sunday Eucharist should be a priority for all families. Likewise, we probably all could be more reverent and more prayerful as we receive the Eucharist.

Pope St. Pius X also promoted singing in the Liturgy. However, congregational singing really was not implemented in most parishes in this country until the reform of the Liturgy during the Second Vatican Council. Initially many Catholics had a hard time with the introduction of singing into the Liturgy. When people would criticize those who did not sing, my response was to remind them that singing in church had not been part of our tradition. However, fifty-one years later many people still do not sing at Mass. I wonder if more people would be attracted to the Catholic Church if they came to Catholic churches and found enthusiastic singing.

In less than a month, Pope Francis will come to the United States for the World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia. While he is here, he will also meet with President Obama, address the U.S. Congress and the United Nations General Assembly, and canonize Fr. Junipero Serra. In anticipation of his coming, we pray for his safety and that he will awaken in the minds and hearts of the people of the United States the importance of faith in today's society.

Finally, on a personal note, on Tuesday, August 18, I became a great-uncle.


