In early September, Deacon Mike was hired by the Archdiocese to become the first director of the new Secretariat of Pastoral Ministries.

Our Halloween Party serves not only our parishioners and our school students but also the children in the neighborhood. The Halloween Party is one way in which we reach out to the neighborhood by providing a safe, secure, and enjoyable environment to celebrate Halloween.

This Wednesday, November 11, we celebrate Veterans' Day. When veterans are buried, I am always moved by what the funeral honors detail says to the family when presenting the American flag: "On behalf of the President of the United States, (the United States Army; the United States Marine Corps; the United States Navy; or the United States Air Force), and a grateful Nation, please accept this flag as a symbol of our appreciation for your loved one's honorable and faithful service." Wednesday is also the feast of St. Martin of Tours, Bishop. It is interesting that St. Martin had been a soldier in his younger years. Therefore, he was a veteran. He was the first non-martyr with an annual feast in the Western Church. He is patron saint of soldiers.

In this month's envelope packet, there is an envelope for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development collection. IndyCAN congregational network includes several Catholic churches such as St. Monica, St. Gabriel, St. Anthony, and Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Churches.

Other organizations within the Archdiocese benefit from the support of the CCHD. One is St. Vincent de Paul's "Changing Lives Forever" program. Changing Lives Forever guides individuals and families toward lives that thrive financially, emotionally, and spiritually.

This annual collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's anti-poverty grants and education programs throughout the United States. Fifty percent (50%) of the collection's proceeds stay here in our Archdiocese.
