

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 10:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

During this Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, this year's Lenten remembrance is especially appropriate: a key tag with a picture of Pope Francis and the phrase "Merciful Like The Father" on one side and a quote from Pope Francis on the other side, "Let the Church always be a place of mercy and hope, where everyone is welcomed, loved, and forgiven."

In last week's Criterion, it was announced that Father Joe Moriarty has been named a Missionary of Mercy by Pope

Francis. Fr. Joe is a son of Little Flower Parish and a graduate of Little Flower School. He currently serves as the Vice-Rector of Bishop Simon Bruté Seminary.

On most days of Lent, we use Eucharistic Prayer II. As you listen to it, please pay special attention to these references to mercy:

Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection and all who have died in your mercy: welcome them into the light of your face. Have mercy on us all, we pray, that with the blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her Spouse, with the blessed Apostles, and all the Saints who have pleased you throughout the ages, we may merit to be co-heirs to eternal life, and may praise and glorify you through your Son, Jesus Christ.

For Pope Francis, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is an important component of the Jubilee of Mercy. Therefore, please mark your calendars for our Lenten Penance Service on Monday, February 29, at 7 p.m. here at Little Flower.

During Lent, our RCIA catechumens, candidates, and confirmandus begin their final preparation for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist which they will receive at the Easter Vigil Liturgy. This year we have four catechumens (Ben Church, Chad Culpepper, Karen Lientz, and Karen Zilson), three candidates (Jesse Brown, Elizabeth "Dey" Scurlock, and Amanda Wade), and one confirmandus (Tony Wade).

This Sunday at the 8:30 a.m. Mass we celebrate the Rite of Sending. We, as a community, send them to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election this Sunday afternoon at 2 p.m. At the Rite of Election, on the basis of the testimony of their sponsors and catechists and on the reaffirmation of the intention of the catechumens and candidates themselves, Archbishop Tobin will declare them ready to take part in the sacraments of initiation.

Today we also celebrate Valentine's Day. Today is a day when we to pray in a special way for engaged couples and married couples.

The early Christian church had at least two saints named Valentine. According to one story, the Roman Emperor Claudius II in the A.D. 200's forbade young men to marry. The emperor thought single men made better soldiers. A priest named Valentine disobeyed the emperor's order and secretly married young couples. Another story says Valentine was an early Christian who made friends with many children. The Romans imprisoned him because he refused to worship their gods. The children missed him and tossed loving notes between the bars of his cell windows.

Finally, if you have not returned your stewardship card, please do so as soon as possible. Thanks to all those who have already returned their stewardship card.
