O God, let all the nations **Praise You!**

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend is the third *Christ Renews His Parish* women's weekend. Please pray for the participants and the presenters.

May is traditionally the month of Mary. We will celebrate May Crowning this Friday, May 6, at the 8:30 a.m. all-school Mass. All are invited to this beautiful traditional ceremony.

This Sunday afternoon I will concelebrating Monsignor Frederick C. Easton's 50th Anniversary Mass at St. Charles in Bloomington. Msgr. Easton was the Vicar Judicial of the Archdiocese from 1980 until his retirement in 2011. He was my "boss" at the Tribunal for all of those years. After I came to Little Flower in 2003, he frequently helped with confessions at our Penance Services until his retirement. Congratulations to Msgr. Easton!

This week also marks the anniversaries of the deaths of Fr. Paul English and Fr. Myles Smith, both of whom served as associate pastors at Little Flower. Fr. Paul English served as associate pastor from 1976-1978. Fr. Myles Smith served as associate pastor from 1973-1974 and was in residence from 1976-1977. Please pray for them this week.

This week several people have commented how moved they were by the First Communion Liturgy last Sunday. First Communion always reminds everyone present of their own First Communion no matter how many years ago it was. For example, I told the children that my First Communion was May 6, 1956, sixty years ago. Also, when adults see the excitement and the faith of the children, it often helps deepen their own faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

The Gospels during the liturgical season of Easter come for the most part from St. John's Gospel. Last Sunday's Gospel came from St. John's account of the Last Supper. During my homily last Sunday, I told a well-known and beautiful story about St. John that was recounted by St. Jerome:

when the holy Evangelist John was living at Ephesus and was far advanced in years, his disciples would carry him into church. Being unable to give a lengthy sermon, at each gathering he was accustomed simply to repeat the words, "Children, love one another." His disciples and the brethren who were present, upon hearing these same words repeatedly, became impatient and asked, "Master, why do you always say the same thing?" John's reply was wholly in harmony with his heart: "Because it is the Lord's commandment; and if you did nothing more, it would suffice."
