Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate Pentecost, the sending of the Holy Spirit. Someone recently asked why the Church chose the color red for Pentecost. Red is the color of fire. "Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit..." [Acts 2:3-4a]. Our traditional prayer to the Holy Spirit begins, "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love."

The word *Pentecost* means the fiftieth day. Pentecost was the Greek name given to the Jewish Feast of Weeks, which fell on the fiftieth day after Passover. Our Pentecost falls on the fiftieth day after Easter.

Today also marks the end of the liturgical season of Easter. During the Easter Season, the Paschal or Easter Candle is lit at all Masses. After today, the Paschal or Easter candle will only be lit for baptisms and funerals.

Tomorrow we return to Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time, "the mystery of Christ itself is honored in all its fullness." During Ordinary Time, green vestments are worn. In the Liturgy, green is the color of hope.

From 1942-1966, May 15 was an important day for school children at Little Flower. It was Fr. John Riedinger's birthday. At least when I was in school, sometimes school was dismissed either immediately after 8:00 a.m. Mass or at noon. Other times his birthday meant added recess. It was on May 15, 1962, his 80th birthday, that the steeple was placed on the church. It took two tries. The first time it was turned the wrong direction. Sunday, May 15, 1966, his 84th birthday, marked Fr. John's retirement. Msgr. Raymond Bosler became pastor of Little Flower on Monday, May 16, 1966. Fr. John was born on May 15, 1882.

The last two weeks we have celebrated 50th wedding anniversaries. On Sunday, May 1, at the 8:30 a.m. Mass we celebrated David and Charlotte Allstatt's 50th wedding anniversary. Both of them continue to be active in the parish. Charlotte is a lector and an office volunteer. David is an usher and takes mailings to the post office. On Saturday, May 7, at the 5:00 p.m. Mass, we celebrated Jack and Cathy Mears' 50th wedding anniversary. For many years Cathy was a Eucharistic Minister and washed and ironed the linens for Mass. Likewise, for many years, Jack was Joe Reid's volunteer assistant. We thank them not only for their 50 years of marriage but also for their service to Little Flower parish.


