Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Dear Parish Family,

Tuesday is the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holyday of Obligation. **Masses will be at 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.** The 6:00 p.m. Mass will be our annual Mass of Remembrance. At this Mass, we remember in a special way all of our parishioners who died this past year as well as others who were buried from Little Flower. Please make an effort to join us in remembering and celebrating the lives of so many individuals that were an important part of our parish and in supporting their families.

Wednesday is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls Day. **Masses will be at 8:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.** On this day, we pray for all the faithful departed who may need our prayers. Traditionally large numbers of Catholics also attended Mass on All Souls Day or at least came to Church to pray for all those who have gone before us in death but remain in need of our prayers. In the days when there were a sufficient number of priests, All Souls Day was one of only two days when a priest could celebrate three Masses. The other was Christmas!

Both of All Saints Day and All Souls Day remind us of the unbreakable bond between us and those who have gone before us in death. We ask the all the saints in heaven to pray for us, and we pray for all the souls in Purgatory.

Both the 8:30 a.m. All Saints Day Mass and the 8:30 a.m. All Souls Day Mass will be all-school Masses. Therefore, there will **not** be an all-school Mass on Friday, November 4.

When I talk to funeral directors or read obituaries, it becomes very clear that funeral practices are changing. For example, many times obituaries refer to funerals as Celebrations of Life. Sometimes there is no visitation or funeral but only a burial rite. In a few cases, there are no rites of any kind. I realize that in some cases, these decisions are based on finances, but there is real value in celebrating a Christian funeral. For example, I am told that there has been some research which shows that when there is no visitation, grieving takes longer.

In contrast, the General Introduction to the Order of Christian Funerals in the Catholic Church offers an explanation of our Catholic funeral rites:

5. Christians celebrate the funeral rites to offer worship, praise, and thanksgiving to God for the gift of a life which has now been returned to God, the author of life and the hope of the just....

6. The Church through its funeral rites commends the dead to God's merciful love and pleads for the forgiveness of their sins..... Though separated from the living, the dead are still at one with the community of believers on earth and benefit from their prayers and intercession.....

7. The celebration of the Christian funeral brings hope and consolation to the living.....

The annual All-Class Reunion for Little Flower School is this coming Saturday November 5. We are hoping that many alumni will attend as we celebrate the school's 90th Anniversary. Please see information elsewhere in the bulletin. Pass the word along to school alumni. Reservations are due by Monday, October 31.

Because of the All-Class reunion this Saturday, November 5, there will be no confessions on Saturday, November 5.

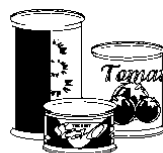
