

In my bulletin letter last weekend, I briefly discussed our Catholic Funeral Rites. This past Tuesday the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith issued an Instruction titled *Ad resurgendum cum Christo (To Rise With Christ)*, on burial rites involving the ashes or cremains of the deceased. According to the Instruction, "the ashes of the faithful must be laid to rest in a sacred place, that is, in a cemetery or, in certain cases, in a church or an area, which has been set aside for this purpose, and so dedicated by the competent ecclesial authority." The Instruction goes on to say that the ashes should not be kept in homes or divided among family members or scattered or preserved in "mementos, pieces of jewelry, or other objects." These directives are rooted in our Catholic Christian belief in the resurrection of Jesus and the resurrection of the body.

Wednesday is the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome and the mother church of Western Christianity.
