If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

### SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

**Dear Parish Family,**

Today is World Marriage Day. Today we congratulate all married couples. As Catholics, we believe that the marriage of two Christians is a sacrament. In other words, the love of a Christian man and woman for each other in marriage is not only a sign of Christ's love for the Church but also makes that love real and present in our world.

In the pre-Vatican marriage rite, the priest usually did not give a homily at a wedding but read an instruction. Although the language is somewhat dated, the instruction is still very beautiful. I would like to share just a small part of the instruction with you:

...And so, not knowing what is before you, you take each other for better or for worse, for richer or for poorer, in sickness and in health, until death.

Truly, then, these words are most serious. It is a beautiful tribute to your undoubted faith in each other, that, recognizing their full import, you are nevertheless so willing and ready to pronounce them. And because these words involve such solemn obligations, it is most fitting that you rest the security of your wedded life upon the great principle of self-sacrifice. ....Sacrifice is usually difficult and irksome. Only love can make it easy; and perfect love can make it a joy. We are willing to give in proportion as we love. And when love is perfect, the sacrifice is complete....

This Sunday we will celebrate the Rite of Illumination with our First Communicants at the 8:30 a.m. Mass. The children have been learning about how we celebrate as a family and as God's people. This rite reinforces what the children have been learning and how important it is to attend Mass every Sunday. They will also receive a lit candle which represents the "Light of Christ" that was given at baptism and reminds us that Jesus is the "Light of the World." Please continue to keep these children and their families in your prayers during these months of preparation.

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, is March 1. As you may remember from last year, **Best Lent Ever** is a FREE, video-based email program featuring Matthew Kelly. This year he will share short daily video reflections based on the chapters of *Resisting Happiness*, the book that we gave out at Christmas. I encourage you to sign up at <http://dynamiccatholic.com/bestlentever/#signup>.

Thank you to all who commented on my homily last Sunday. According to the Indiana Catholic Conference website, "shaping public policy is the responsibility of every person. Our democratic form of government and our Church both call us to become involved." The Indiana Catholic Conference analyzes political issues from a social and moral point of view. "Issues important to the Church are selected by the ICC Board of Directors for further research. The ICC staff then researches and drafts a position statement based on the teachings of the Church as well as pertinent secular information." Through the Indiana Catholic Action Network (I-CAN), Catholics can then have a direct impact on legislative action. I want to thank Kevin Gawrys, Little Flower School principal, for his State of the School message on Sunday, January 29. I would highlight just one of his many points:

...one thing has remained constant at LF. We are, as we were in 1926, a Catholic school, first and foremost....Our students learn and practice the values of the Gospel. Our interactions and our discipline are guided by Jesus' command to love one another. Our curriculum is infused with the principles of Catholic Social Justice, recognizing the dignity of every person and striving to be the hands and feet of Jesus for the poor and oppressed.

Also, thank you to the Little Flower School faculty and staff and the School Commission for hosting the school open house that afternoon. Not only did several prospective families visit the school, several enrolled their children at the open house. Please know that you are welcome to visit the school. If you would like to visit, please call the school office to make an appointment.

Finally, congratulations to Kevin Johnson, Little Flower Class of 73, who received the Career Achievement Award at this year's annual Archdiocesan Celebrating Catholic School Values event last Thursday evening. Kevin and his wife Lori (Watts), also LF Class of 73, are members of Holy Spirit Parish.

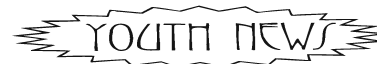
