**Dear Parish Family,**

During Lent, our RCIA catechumens, and candidates begin their final preparation for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist which they will receive at the Easter Vigil Liturgy. This year we have four adults and eight children preparing to receive Sacraments of Initiation. Our catechumens are Vanessa Arellano, Gary Ballou, Mercades Cheever, Francis Fey, Josh Orndorff, Trent Short, Ronald Stillions, Danielle Stillions, Seth Stillions. Our candidates are Alexis Dohleman, Angelica Ortiz, and Carolina Ortiz.

This Sunday at the 8:30 a.m. Mass we celebrate the Rite of Sending. We, as a community, send them to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election this Sunday afternoon at 2 p.m. At the Rite of Election, on the basis of the testimony of their sponsors and catechists and on the reaffirmation of the intention of the catechumens and candidates themselves, Msgr. William Stumpf, Archdiocesan Administrator, will declare them ready to take part in the Sacraments of Initiation.

Please mark your calendars. Our Lenten Penance Service will be Monday evening, March 13, at 7:00 p.m. at Our Lady of Lourdes. During Lent, we prepare to celebrate not only Jesus' resurrection but also our own resurrection to new life in him. We can only do that by dying to sin and selfishness in our own lives. We do this by prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We do this by receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation which not only forgives our sins but also empowers us to live more Christ-like lives.

I want to thank all of our parishioners who generously donated to the new sound system and the Archdiocese for the \$18,000 grant to help purchase the system. As I am writing this, a little work remains to be done. However, the feedback we have received has been overwhelmingly positive. Even as close as I am to the ambo and the choir, I could hear and understand everything better than before.

As Tom leaves his position of Director of Stewardship and Parish Administration on March 31, we will need to look at issues of building access. It is unfair to expect staff to be present seven days a week from early in the morning to late in the evening. One policy has already been established. No meetings will be scheduled on Sunday evenings in the parish center unless a staff member schedules it and will be present for it.

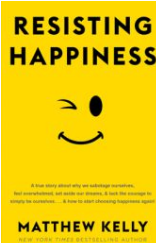
The 2017 Race for Vocations Saturday, May 6, 2017
