

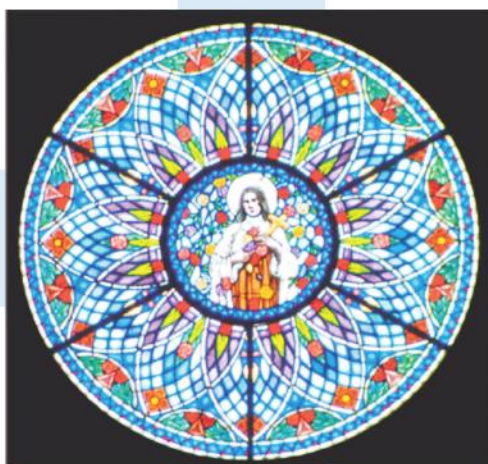

Third Sunday of Lent

**Dear Parish Family,**

Today is the Third Sunday of Lent. This weekend at the Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass we begin the Scrutinies of our Elect, our former Catechumens and Candidates, who will receive Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. At the First Scrutiny, the former catechumens are anointed with the Oil of Catechumens and all the Elect are presented with the Ten Commandments.

Next week's Scrutiny will take place at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, and the following weekend's Scrutiny will take place at the Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass. The purpose of each of the scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect" and "to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good" (RCIA, 141).

Thank you to those who returned their stewardship cards today. If you forgot yours, please return it next week.

I want to thank Tom for his excellent stewardship witness talk last weekend. He made many excellent points that should challenge all of us:

- "It's all about us.....all of us."
- "...each of us individually can make all the difference. If our individual presence or contributions are missing, then we collectively are less."
- "...generally speaking, good stewards feel like they get back more than they give."
- "Finally....one of the secrets to being a good steward is giving back to God first. It's just not the same when we only give back the leftovers."

Thanks to everyone who participated in the Ministry Fair last Sunday, both those who represented ministries and those who visited the fair. The Ministry Fair is a powerful reminder of how many ministries our parish sponsors. Thanks to those who signed up for new ministries. Finally, thanks to Bill and Debbie Belles for hosting coffee and donuts and fruit throughout the morning. They were representing the ministry of Sunday morning coffee and donuts.

In the liturgical calendar, March 19 is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He was declared Patron of the Universal Church in 1870 by Pope Pius IX. Because his Solemnity Falls on the Third Sunday of Lent, it is transferred to Monday, March 20.

March 19 is also the fourth anniversary of the installation of Pope Francis. He was elected Pope on March 13, 2013.

Little Flower preschool has been accredited by Advanc-Ed and we are now eligible to

accept students with On My Way Pre-K and IndyPSP grants. On My Way Pre-K applications are now available for grants to eligible children who will be 4 years old, but not yet 5 years old on August 1, 2017, and will be attending kindergarten in the 2018-19 school year. These grants will be good for pre-K programs starting in August 2017.

For families who live in Marion County, grants are also available for children who will be 3 years old on August 1, 2017, through Indy Preschool Scholarship Program (IndyPSP) grants. 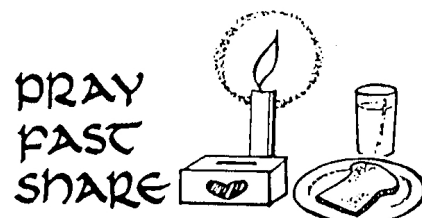
