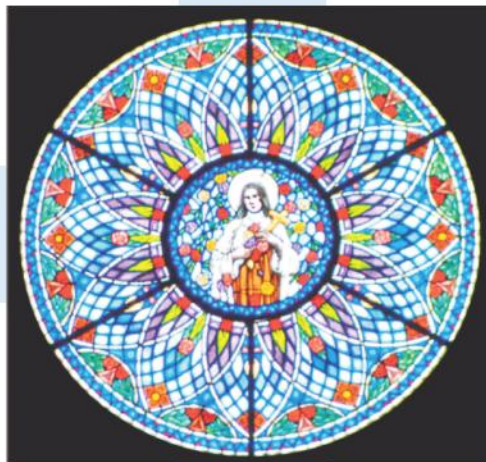

Fourth Sunday of Lent



Dear Parish Family,

We welcome Fr. Patrick Cooney, OSB, as the celebrant and homilist of this Sunday's 8:30 a.m. Mass. As you may remember, Fr. Patrick is a monk of St. Meinrad Archabbey who is serving as the Defender of the Bond at the Metropolitan Tribunal and living at Little Flower.

Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, the mid-point of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent was traditionally called Laetare Sunday. *Laetare* is a Latin word that means rejoice. Therefore, priests are invited to wear rose vestments. This might be a good day to review for ourselves how we are doing keeping our Lenten promises.

Holy Week is only two weeks away. Please make plans to attend the Holy Week Services. Palm Sunday Masses will be at their regular times. The Holy Thursday and Good Friday Liturgies will be at 7:00 p.m. The Holy Saturday Easter Vigil will be at 8:00 p.m. Please consider attending as many of these Liturgies as possible. Holy Week is the holiest week of the year for Catholics.

As we get older, time passes more quickly, and, at least for me, past events do not seem as long ago as they are. Today is the 33rd anniversary of the death of Fr. Louis Gootee who lived at Little Flower after his retirement. Next Sunday is the 12th anniversary of the death of St. John Paul II.

However, Saturday is the 47th anniversary of the death of Fr. John Reidy who was an associate pastor at Little Flower from December 15, 1960 to April 1961. I was in 6th grade at the time. In fact, I think I served his first weekday Mass at Little Flower during my first week as a server. That year our teacher assigned us to write a vocation essay (what we wanted to be when we grew up), and we had to interview someone in our chosen vocation, profession, or career, so I interviewed Fr. Reidy. Although Fr. Reidy was only here a short time, he had a significant impact on me. On March 19, 1961, I wrote (please excuse my grammar and punctuation):

I talked to Fr. Reidy and he said that he and Father John would not give it up for anything. He said you meet interesting people and see interesting things. He told me a little story. He said, "There was a man that could be one of the twelve apostles. This certain man asked Our Lord what to do to get to heaven. Our Lord said he should keep the commandments, and the man said he always did. Then Our Lord said he should give up all his riches. The man did not reply he just left Our Lord.

Pope Francis' universal prayer intention for the month of April is for young people, that young people may respond generously to their vocations and seriously consider offering themselves to God in the priesthood or consecrated life.

Congratulations to Sr. Sheila Hackett, O.P., Sceecina Memorial High School librarian and Little Flower Parishioner, who received this year's Hibernian Presidents' Award. Sr. Sheila was born in South Tipperary. This year Sister is celebrating her 62nd anniversary in religious life and her 51st anniversary in Catholic education.

Also, congratulations to Mary Margaret Coffey, Little Flower Class of 1971, who was selected as Indy's 2017 Irish Citizen of the Year and Grand Marshal for the Indy Sports Foundation's 37th Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade. She serves as President and Chair of Indy Irish Fest.

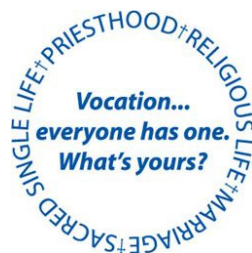
