

Special thanks to the members of the liturgical choir who also served other Masses this weekend. They include: Anna Erdosy, Faye Eskew, Lashanti Gunn, and Reanna Hollada. Also, every year the

management and staff of the Indianapolis Marriott East do an outstanding job with our social and dinner. A successful All-Class Reunion requires a collaborative and cooperative effort on the part of all.

Feedback from alumni, especially the honorees and their families, suggests that the evening could not have gone better. The food was delicious. Alumni, however, most enjoy the opportunity to visit with former classmates and friends. The highlight of the evening, of course, was the presentation of awards.

For the past 27 years, Mike has been a volunteer for the Alzheimer's Association of Greater Indianapolis, including eight years on the Board of Directors. Mike and his wife Susan (LF Class of 1970) are members of Holy Spirit at Geist Parish in Fishers, Indiana, where he is a member of the liturgy committee, a Eucharistic minister, an usher, and an altar server.

Kevin and Lori Watts Johnson both graduated from Little Flower in 1973 and Scecina in 1977. They fondly remember Little Flower being the center of everything in their lives, whether it be faith, family, or friends. They were married at Little Flower in 1981. Their children, Anne and Tommy, were both baptized at Little Flower. During their young married life, Lori was instrumental in starting a "Young Married Couples" group and coached volleyball and kickball. Kevin served on the Parish Council and was a Eucharistic minister. Together, they were moderators of the CYO Youth Group. After moving to Seymour, Indiana, in 1991, they were both very active members of St. Ambrose Parish and in the larger community. Since moving back to Indianapolis, Lori and Kevin have been active members of Holy Spirit Parish and are actively involved with Scecina Memorial High School, Lori as a member of the Scecina Women's Circle and Kevin as a member of the Scecina Board of Directors.

Sister Davida Lund, OSF graduated from Little Flower in 1951. After graduating from St. Mary Academy, she joined the Sisters of St. Francis, Oldenburg, on September 8, 1955. Sister Davida spent over 35 years teaching in schools across Indiana, Illinois, Ohio, and Missouri. She was a Pastoral Assistant for 4 years in Beattyville, Kentucky, and a receptionist at St. Anthony Messenger Press in Cincinnati, Ohio, for 9 years. She returned to the Motherhouse in Oldenburg, Indiana, in 2010, where she has since served as a telephone operator. Sister Davida is not only an alumna of Little Flower. She also had the privilege (her words) of teaching at Little Flower from 1981 to 1984.


