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Dear Parish Family,

This weekend at the Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass we celebrate the First Scrutiny with our Elect, our former Catechumens and Candidates, and our *Confirmandi*. At the First Scrutiny, the former catechumens are anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, and all the Elect are presented with the Ten Commandments.

Next week's Scrutiny will take place at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, and the following weekend's Scrutiny will take place at the Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass. The purpose of each of the scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect" and "to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good" (RCIA, 141).

Our Lenten Penance Service is this Monday, March 5, at 7 p.m. here at Little Flower. We will be joined by the parishioners of Our Lady of Lourdes, our RCIA candidates, and our children preparing for First Communion. Eight priests are scheduled to be available for confessions. Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation as a gift, not a burden. Please take this opportunity to be reconciled to God and others.

For those who may not be able to come to our Penance Service, St. Philip's Penance Service will be Thursday evening at 7:00 p.m. I will be helping with confessions there.

The last few weeks I have tried to pass on some useful information, and I want to continue that today. Although Little Flower always has a large number of funerals, it seems that we have had even more than usual this past year. From my experience working with so many families at the time of a death, I would like to write something about funeral homes and funeral directors. When a death happens suddenly and there has been no preplanning, families often do not know which funeral home to choose.

Although pre-planning a funeral is not necessary, I would encourage you to have your own plan if a death occurs. Both costs and quality of service can vary greatly from one funeral home to another. In some cases, people are paying the same amount for a casket of lesser quality than they would for a casket of greater quality in another funeral home. Other times funeral homes who advertise lower costs make their money by adding extra charges for everything. Some funeral homes are locally owned and operated. Others are owned by large corporations. Some funeral homes and funeral directors have more understanding of Catholic funerals than others.

My point is that we would all do well to have some thoughts about what we would do if a loved one died and we were responsible for making arrangements for his or her funeral. Of course, many people have a preferred funeral home and/or funeral director. If you have a preferred funeral director, please do not hesitate to ask for that person.

Finally, I will be out of the office on Tuesday to attend the priests' Lenten Day of Reflection.
