### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 10:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

### SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Today marks the end of the Liturgical Season of Christmas.

Originally, the baptism of Jesus was included in the celebration of the Epiphany. The Epiphany originally celebrated three events in Jesus' life: the visit of the magi, Jesus' baptism, and the miracle at the wedding feast of Cana. All three were understood to be manifestations of the Son of God. This ancient understanding of the Epiphany is remembered in the antiphon for the Cantic of Mary in Evening Prayer II for the Solemnity of the Epiphany in the Liturgy of the Hours:

Three mysteries mark this holy day: today the star leads the Magi to the infant Christ; today water is changed into wine for the wedding feast; today

Christ wills to be baptized by John in the river Jordan to bring us salvation.

Although the visit by the Magi had been almost the sole focus of the Epiphany for a very long time, it was only after the Octave Day of the Epiphany was abolished as a feast in 1955 that a feast titled the "Commemoration of the Baptism of our Lord" was established. It was originally on January 13, which formerly had been the Octave Day of the Epiphany which itself had been focused on the baptism of Jesus. The baptism of Jesus marked the beginning of his public ministry.

This weekend at the 8:30 a.m. Mass we welcome our candidates for First Eucharist and their parents as we celebrate their Rite of Enrollment in First Eucharist preparation. Please pray for these children and their parents as they begin preparation for First Eucharist.

Tomorrow begins Week 1 of Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ in all its fullness. During Ordinary Time, green is the liturgical color, the color of hope.

This Thursday, January 17, at 7:00 p.m. in the Little Flower School Cafeteria, Brie Anne (Eichhorn) Varick, Archdiocesan Coordinator for Human Life and Dignity, will discuss Human Dignity and Respect for Life. This is the second of four follow-up sessions to Archbishop Thompson's talk to the Eastside Catholic Community last September on his recent pastoral letter, *We are One in Christ: A Pastoral Letter on Fundamentals of Christian Anthropology*. You do not need to have attended Archbishop Thompson's talk or the first follow-up to attend this session. Please enter through Door 6.

Friday begins the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (January 18-25). Traditionally January 18 was the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter at Rome. January 25 was and is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. The theme for 2019 is "Justice, Only Justice, You Shall Pursue" (cf. Deuteronomy 16:18-20). According to the Greymoor Ecumenical and Interreligious Institute, this theme "was chosen for its powerful message of promoting truth, equality and unity."

On a personal note, once again I want to thank you for all your Christmas gifts. You are a wonderfully generous and supportive parish. If I missed sending a thank you note to anyone who gave me a Christmas gift, I apologize.

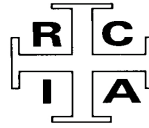
