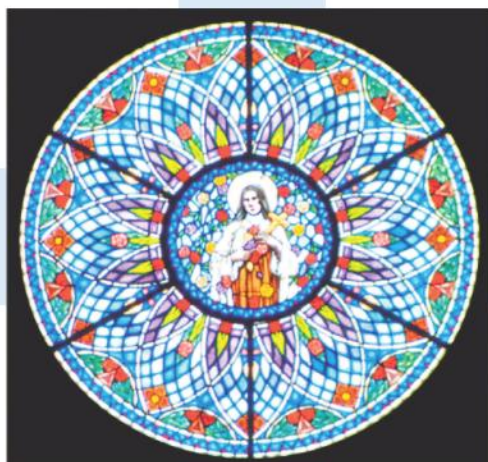

Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend at the Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass we celebrate the First Scrutiny with our Elect, our former Catechumens, and our Conфирmandi. At the First Scrutiny, the former catechumens are anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, and all the Elect are presented with the Ten Commandments.

Next week's Scrutiny will take place at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, and the following weekend's Scrutiny will take place at the Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass. The purpose of each of the scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect" and "to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good" (RCIA, 141).

Our Lenten Penance Service is this Monday, March 25, at 7 p.m. at Our Lady of Lourdes. Several priests are scheduled to be available for confessions. Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation as a gift, not a burden. Please take this opportunity to be reconciled to God and others.

On Tuesday, March 12, I met with a surgeon. He recommended that I meet with a radiation oncologist before making a final decision whether to have surgery or radiation. As I am writing this, I have an appointment with a radiation oncologist on Wednesday, March 20. Please continue praying that I will make a good treatment decision and for my healing.

The tragic and untimely deaths of Fr. Kevin Morris and Fr. Glen O'Connor are a powerful reminder of the fragility of our lives. However, they are also a powerful reminder of the lack of priests in our Archdiocese.

Finally, please note the insert in the bulletin regarding the Oldenburg Sisters of St. Francis 6th Annual Cardinals vs. Reds Raffle. Tickets are \$5 each or five tickets for \$20. If you are a baseball fan, this is a way to support the Sisters of St. Francis who staffed Little Flower School for so many years. Ticket orders and money may be mailed to Oldenburg, brought to the parish office, or dropped in the collection. Sold tickets must be mailed to Oldenburg no later than April 24, 2019.

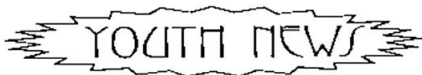
United Catholic Appeal

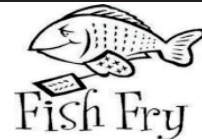

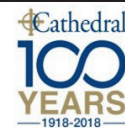
Stained Glass Raffle
