

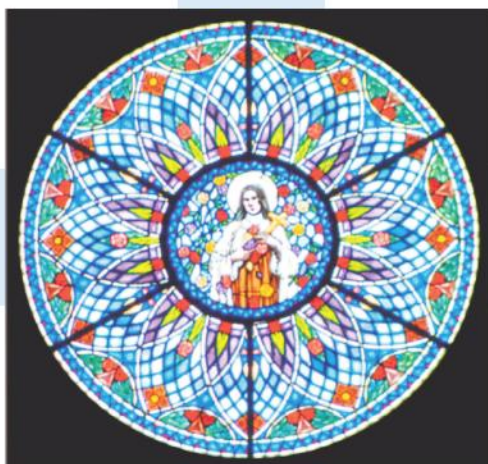

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 10:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

The parish staff and I want to wish all mothers a blessed and happy Mothers' Day. Today is your day. Please celebrate and enjoy!

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Easter, which is also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." It is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations or Vocation Sunday. The purpose of this day is to publically fulfill Jesus' instruction to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" [Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2].

Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, societies of apostolic life or secular institutes. Last weekend, May 3 and 4, was Little Flower Catholic School's annual musical. This year's production was *Disney Beauty and the Beast Jr.* By my count, more than 40 Little Flower students were members of the cast or production staff. Congratulations and thanks to all of the students, and special thanks to Mr. Gabe Elam, the Director; Mrs. Nancy Herrman, the Choreographer; Mr. David Wissel, the Set Designer; Anne Hook, Jennifer Dye, Autumn Davis, and Lynda Trimble who worked on Costume Design; and all the parents, teachers, volunteers, and parish staff for their assistance and support.

Wednesday we remember once again Fr. John C. Riedinger, Little Flower's pastor from 1942-1966. Fr. John was born on May 15, 1882. Fr. John was almost 60 when he was appointed pastor of Little Flower. He retired when he turned 84. When I was in school, Fr. John's birthday usually meant a free day (rarely), a shortened day, or extra recess. It was on May 15, 1962 that the steeple was placed on the church. The entire school, the Scecina band, many parishioners, and many neighbors were present. After the steeple was placed on the church, Fr. John rushed over to the crane operator and told him that it was facing the wrong direction. They had to take it down. Everyone left because they were not going to try again until after lunch. Many returned in the afternoon.

PLAN TO GET YOUR WRISTBAND

Once again this year, those attending the festival will be required to purchase \$10 in coupons prior to admittance to the grounds. These coupons can be used as cash any place on the festival grounds. However, parishioners can bypass this requirement by securing and wearing one of our special festival wristbands. If you have and wear this wristband, you can come and go as you please all weekend without the need to purchase tickets.
