Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 10:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.



Dear Parish Family,

Monday is Memorial Day. Memorial Day is a day to remember those who gave their lives for our country. Our Memorial Day Mass will be at 9:00 a.m. There will be no 5:30 p.m. Communion Service. Also, the Parish Office and the School will be closed on Monday.

Traditionally Memorial Day was a day to remember those who gave their lives for our country. For example, Lt. Ruth M. Gardiner, a 1928 graduate of Little Flower School, was the first Army flight nurse to give her life in the service of her country during the second World War. In July 1944, a United States Army Hospital in Chicago was named in her memory.

However, because of the numbers of military personnel who have returned home with catastrophic injuries from more recent wars and conflicts, I would suggest that in addition to praying for those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our country and for freedom, we pray for those who have suffered catastrophic injuries and for the safety of all of our military personnel wherever they may be.

KING'S ISLAND



The raffle has potential to bring money in from outside the parish and that is always very helpful. PLAN TO GET YOUR WRISTBAND

Once again this year, those attending the festival will be required to purchase \$10 in coupons prior to admittance to the grounds. These coupons can be used as cash any place on the festival grounds. However, parishioners can bypass this requirement by securing and wearing one of our special festival wristbands. If you have and wear this wristband, you can come and go as you please all weekend without the need to purchase tickets. Without a parish wristband, no one under the age of 18 will be admitted to the festival unless they are accompanied by an adult.

You may obtain this wristband for yourself, for members of your family, or for friends after Mass this weekend or at the parish office, 9 a.m. until 3 p.m., Tuesday thru Friday. For your convenience, the office will be open from 6 p.m. until 8 p.m. on May 29 and 30. Wristbands should be picked up by an adult. Please plan ahead and get your wristband and find out who among your family and friends will attend so you can get one for them. We do ask that you not pick up wristbands for others unless you are sure they will be attending. Pre-sale ride tickets will also be available at these times. Please plan to purchase tickets in advance, as they are less expensive for you and the percentage of profit for the parish is greater on advance sale tickets! **THE SPECIAL PARISH WRISTBANDS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE AFTER 3 P.M. ON FRIDAY MAY 31.**
