SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 10:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate Pentecost, the sending of the Holy Spirit. The word *Pentecost* means the fiftieth day. Pentecost was the Greek name given to the Jewish Feast of Weeks, which fell on the fiftieth day after Passover. Our Pentecost falls on the fiftieth day after Easter. Today also marks the end of the liturgical season of Easter. During the Easter Season the Paschal or Easter Candle is lit at all Masses. After today, the Paschal or Easter candle will only be lit for baptisms and funerals.

Tomorrow we return to Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time, “the mystery of Christ itself is honored in all its fullness.” During Ordinary Time, green vestments are worn. In the Liturgy, green is the color of hope. Monday we celebrate the feast of Mary, Mother of the Church.

Summerfest 2019 was wonderful!!! For the third year in a row, we were blessed with perfect weather despite predictions of rain on Saturday. We can only be grateful to God for the beautiful weather.

Every year as Summerfest approaches, so many people become involved: festival volunteers, parishioners selling raffle tickets, and parishioners coming to the festival and encouraging others to come. I am always amazed by the number of volunteers who are here throughout the entire festival, often volunteering in various capacities. In addition, some of these were the same people who worked hard both on set-up and take-down. Thank you to all of you who worked so hard to make the festival a success. Special thanks to all those who took off work to help with the festival! Summerfest benefits the parish not only financially but also builds community within the parish and brings the larger community together.

There really were no problems during the festival. When we decided to require wristbands, one of the best decisions we made was to allow teenagers and children with Little Flower wristbands to have free access to the festival without a parent or guardian.

We also have to be grateful to all our sponsors and to all those who donate goods and services for the Silent Auction, especially our friends at the Steer-In for providing the beef and noodles dinner Saturday evening. 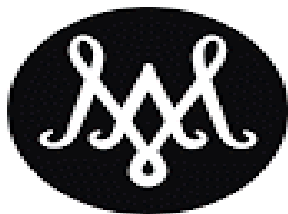
