Dear Parish Family,

Today is Catechetical Sunday. This year's theme is "Stay with Us." This is a very appropriate theme when we recognize how many Catholics are no longer actively practicing their Catholic faith or are leaving the Catholic church to join other churches.

This year's Little Flower Novena begins this Wednesday, September 18, at 5:30 p.m. The 1945 Jubilee Brochure described the first Little Flower Novena:

The first public novena in honor of the Little Flower came to a close on her feast, September 30, 1927. Crowds from all over the city participated in this novena, the average nightly attendance being about 700. Closing night, an estimated 1500 persons were present.

Each evening the novena will consist of the novena prayers, a reading from Fr. Ron Rolheiser, and a Communion Service. The schedule for the novena is as follows:

Wednesday, September 18 Monday, September 23 Monday, September 30 Thursday, September 19 Tuesday, September 24 Tuesday, October 1 Friday, September 20 Wednesday, September 25 Thursday, September 26

The Solemn Closing of the novena will take place on Tuesday October 1, the Feast of St. Therese. Instead of a Communion Service, the Solemn Closing will end with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Also, on Tuesday, October 1, we will celebrate the Feast of St. Therese with an all-school Mass at 8:30 a.m. As a parish, we will celebrate her feast at all the Masses on the weekend of October 5-6.

The Catholic Church is facing many challenges, many of which are affecting our parish. I would encourage you to attend the Novena to pray that through the prayers of St. Therese, the Church and our parish may respond well to these challenges.




