Thank you to the 16 second graders, one fourth grader, and one fifth grader who

It is one of our traditions that those preparing for First Communion participate in the Solemn Closing of the Novena. Tuesday is the feast of St. Teresa of Jesus, Virgin and Doctor of the Church. Together with St. John of the Cross, she founded the reformed (Discalced) Carmelite friars and nuns, the order to which St. Therese of the Infant Jesus belonged. A mystic, she was the first woman doctor of the Church.

Wednesday is the optional memorial of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and First Friday devotions. Wednesday we might want to pray for all those who do not experience the love of God in their lives.

Thursday is the memorial of St. Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop and Martyr. He was the second successor of St. Peter as Bishop of Antioch. He is the first to use the term Catholic Church as a collective designation for Christians. Thursday we might want to pray for all the leaders and members of the Catholic Church.

Friday is the feast of St. Luke, the Evangelist. He is the author of the third Gospel, sometimes called the Gospel of Compassion. He is the patron saint of all those in the medical professions. Friday we might want to pray for those in the medical professions.

Saturday is the memorial of Saints John de Brébeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs. They are often referred to as the North American Martyrs. Saturday we might want to pray for the Jesuit community and the administration, faculty, staff, students, and families of Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School.
