SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 10:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

This Sunday at the 6 p.m. Mass we will celebrate the Rite of Enrollment for our high school Confirmation candidates. This rite will mark the beginning of their preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation from Archbishop Thompson.

Parents, if your children are not baptized or not baptized Catholic, please note the announcement elsewhere in the bulletin about an information meeting concerning the Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC). This meeting will be Wednesday, October 30, at 6:00 p.m. in the Parish Center. The RCIC is open to all children between the ages of 8 and 17.

This Thursday evening, October 31, will be our annual Halloween Party from 6 to 8 p.m. in Duffey Hall. Food and games will be available from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. The costume parade and contest will be at 7:30 p.m. This is a great time for children to trick or treat and celebrate Halloween in a safe environment. There is still a need for individually wrapped bags of candy. They may be dropped off in the baskets that are at the doors of church, at school, or in the Parish Office. Please remember that this Halloween Party is not just for parishioners but also for all our young neighbors. What makes our Halloween Party special is that it is an outreach to our neighborhood and community. Please see the flyer elsewhere in the bulletin.

Friday, November 1, is the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holyday of Obligation. **Masses will be at 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.** The 6:00 p.m. Mass will be our annual **Mass of Remembrance**. I would encourage all of you to attend and pray for all those who have died and been buried from our parish in the last year. Our Mass of Remembrance is important for the families who have lost family members this past year, but it is also important for us as a parish. It is important that we support families of parishioners who have lost loved ones, but it is also important that we remember and celebrate the lives of so many individuals who were an important part of our parish.

Saturday, November 2, is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls Day. **Holy Spirit will celebrate an All Souls Day Mass at 8:30 a.m.** On this day, we pray for all the faithful departed who may need our prayers.

Both All Saints Day and All Souls Day remind us of the unbreakable bond between us and those who have gone before us in death. We ask all the saints in heaven to pray for us, and we pray for all the souls in Purgatory.

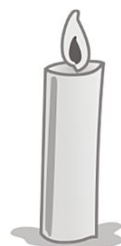

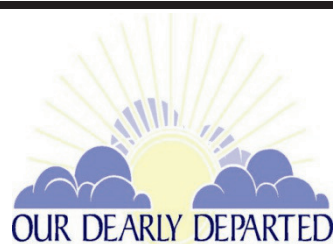

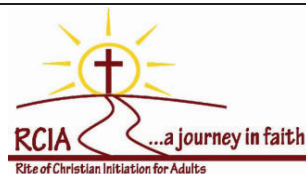
