

Dear Parish Family,

Thanks to all of you who completed and submitted your United Catholic Appeal pledge card and/or the food security survey. I am always uncomfortable filling out pledge cards during Mass. However, the Archdiocese requests that we do it during Mass. If you did not submit a pledge card for one reason or another, please return the pledge card you received in the mail. Additional pledge cards are available at the back of church if you no longer have your pledge card.

In case you were not at Mass last Sunday, I met with my radiation oncologist on November 7. From my blood work, it would appear that the treatments were successful. I have to return to my regular urologist in three months for another checkup. Thank you for all your prayers. I really believe that all the prayers made a real difference in my successful treatment and an even bigger difference in my ability to tolerate the radiation treatments without any significant side effects. Please continue praying for me.

In today's bulletin letter, I would like to share a little information about the first two of this year's Outstanding Alumni.

Sr. Barbara Hileman, OSF, Class of 1947: Barbara Hileman and her parents had lived in Indianapolis less than two years when her mother heard about the reputation that Little Flower School had, and she was determined that Barbara would begin school there. Her grade school years were happy ones for her. Incidentally, her class had more than 50 students in one classroom!

It was in her middle school years that Barbara had first thought about becoming a nun, but she put that thought aside until later high school years. After graduating from St. Mary Academy, Sister Barbara entered the convent, graduated from Marian College, and began a twenty-four year career in elementary education. She then moved into parish ministry until she responded to a request for sisters to serve the Navajo at a remote mission in New Mexico. Later she returned to Indianapolis to serve fourteen years as chaplain at St. Vincent Seton Specialty Hospital. Today Sr. Barbara is retired at the Motherhouse in Oldenburg. Sister Barbara is grateful to Little Flower for preparing her for an interesting, fulfilling and blessed life!

For her 68 years of service as an Oldenburg Franciscan, we honored Sr. Barbara Hileman, O.S.F., as an outstanding alumna of Little Flower Catholic School.

Mike Boyle, Class of 1951: From the time Mike was 4 years old, his family lived on Linwood Street near Nowland. Mike shared, "Little Flower and the neighborhood were my roots. I went all 8 years to Little Flower Grade School, graduating in 1951. LF was the cornerstone of my Catholic education." He graduated from Cathedral High School in 1955 and from Marian College in 1959.

In 1959, Mike was hired as part of the Ford College Graduate Program and started as an accountant. Ford always encouraged community service, so that was his start in volunteering.

Over the years, Mike has taken on many volunteer opportunities. For example, he advised the Warren Township School Board and developed the first accounting curriculum for the Walker Career Center. He also taught a once-a-week class on how to balance a checkbook at Scecina for two semesters and at Perry Meridian and Southport for one semester. He assisted with the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program sponsored by the IRS to prepare income taxes for low-income persons in the inner city of Detroit as well as several locations in Florida.

For being a servant leader through volunteerism, we honored Mike Boyle as an outstanding alumnus of Little Flower Catholic School.
