Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held every other month. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, the last Sunday of the church year. Today also marks the last Sunday on which we will have two Sunday morning Masses. Beginning next week, our Sunday morning Mass will be at 9:30 a.m. Therefore, this Sunday and next Sunday are days of transition.

One change will be in our liturgical music. Today we thank the musical ensemble that has been playing for us at the 10:30 a.m. Mass on the second and fourth Sundays each month over the last 3+ years. This will be their last Sunday with us. Due to our change in Mass schedule, combined with the schedule of our adult choir, there is no longer a time available at Little Flower for them to play. However, they continue to play and sing at St. Philip Neri two Sundays each month. We certainly wish them the best and pass along our gratitude for their service to us at Little Flower. The group includes John Kirby, Director, Bill McNiece, Karen Jacobs, Jeannie McNew, Mike and Jan Gaddis, and Steve Sulkey.

This Thursday, November 28, is Thanksgiving Day! Our Thanksgiving Day Mass will be at 9:00 a.m. There will be no other Masses or Communion Services on Thursday. Little Flower School will anticipate the celebration of Thanksgiving with an all-school Mass on Wednesday at 8:30 a.m.

We all have much for which to be grateful. The three best ways to give thanks for all our blessings on Thanksgiving Day are to celebrate Eucharist as a family, spend quality time with our family and/or friends, and share some of our blessings with those in need.

There will be a collection at the Thanksgiving Day Mass to benefit the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Although your generosity was overwhelming with our Thanksgiving Blessing Bags, I would still invite you, if you wish, to bring a donation of non-perishable food to Mass on Thanksgiving Day. Our St. Vincent De Paul parish emergency food pantry has been hit hard lately with some urgent needs and could use some replenishment. If you are able, or perhaps if you were not able to participate in the Blessing Bag program, feel free to bring a donation to Mass on Thanksgiving Day. It may be placed on the steps around the altar.

You are also invited to bring food for your own dinner to be blessed. Please do not place this food on the steps. You will be invited to bring it forward to be blessed at the end of Mass.

Because of Thanksgiving, the parish offices and school will be closed on Thursday and Friday, November 28 and 29. Also, there will be no Mass or Communion Service on Friday, November 28.

In last week's bulletin, we provided some information on two of this year's Outstanding Alumni. This week we are highlighting the other two.

Bill Bevan, Class of 1959: Bill's family moved to 12th and Riley when he was in the 2nd grade. His parents were active members of Little Flower Parish. His siblings all attended Little Flower Catholic School. Bill graduated from Little Flower, Secena Memorial High School, and attended Marian College. Bill said, "My Catholic faith was instilled by my family and enriched at Little Flower."

Bill worked for Allstate Insurance Company for 40 years as Office Operations Supervisor. When a professional team for the American Basketball Association (ABA) came to Indianapolis, Bill was asked to be a member of the initial statistics crew for the Indiana Pacers, and later he became their official scorer, a position he held for almost 49 of his 51 years with Pacers. He worked more than 2400 games.

Over the years Bill has volunteered as a coach for many teams at Secena. After retiring from Allstate, he became a substitute teacher at Secena, which he has done for several years.

For his 51 years of service to the Indiana Pacers and his dedication to Secena Memorial High School, we honored Bill Bevan as an outstanding alumnus of Little Flower Catholic School.

Bob Gavaghan, Class of 1973: Bob grew up at 820 Dequincy, the youngest of five children of Jim and Betty Griffin Gavaghan. He and his siblings all attended Little Flower School as did his mother. Bob is married to Susie Manley ('78) Gavaghan, and they have two children. Bob is a great family man who does not like the limelight and stays in the background. He attends daily Mass every day during Lent and many other days as well. Over the years Bob has coached CYO basketball at Holy Spirit, and he is currently helping his daughter coach girls basketball at Our Lady of Lourdes.

Bob reaches out to people in need. Bob began organizing the Gav's Classic Basketball Tournament in 1976. Since 1985 it has been a fundraiser. The total amount raised to this day is \$81,000. For example, this year's Classic honored Marydell Moran and David Short. 50% of the money went to Outreach Indiana in David's name, and 50% went to Marydell's husband for medical expenses. David, a Little Flower graduate, passed away of a car crash on April 19th, and Marydell passed away on April 12th. David was a huge supporter of Outreach Indiana. Marydell and Lee Joe allowed the Classic to be played at their house on Emerson for 13 years. David also played in the Classic five times.

For reaching out to help people in need through Gav's Classic Basketball Tournament, we honored Bob Gavaghan as an outstanding alumnus of Little Flower Catholic School.

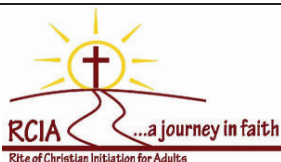
Spreading the Holiday Scrip Shopping Cheer!
