Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend at the Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass we celebrate the First Scrutiny with our Elect, our former Catechumens, and our *Confirmandi*. At the First Scrutiny, the former catechumens are anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, and all the Elect are presented with the Ten Commandments.

Next week's Scrutiny will take place at the 9:30 a.m. Mass, and the following weekend's Scrutiny will take place at the Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass. The purpose of each of the scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect" and "to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good" (RCIA, 141).

Happy St. Patrick's Day to all! St. Patrick was the apostle of Ireland. For example, according to tradition, St. Patrick used a shamrock to explain the mystery of the Trinity. When I was a child, some years my aunts and uncles in Ireland would send real Irish shamrocks for St. Patrick's Day, which in turn I would take to school.

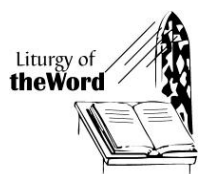
This week's All-School Mass will be on Wednesday, March 18, at 9:30 a.m. instead of Friday.

Spiritual Adoption Week 6

Hi again. My nose, mouth, and ears are beginning to take shape. My head is oversized, and dark spots appear where my eyes and nostrils are starting to form. My emerging ears are marked by small depressions on the sides of the head, and my arms and legs by protruding buds. My heart is beating about 100 to 160 times a minute — almost twice as fast as yours — and blood is beginning to course through my body. My intestines are developing, and the bud of tissue that will give rise to my lungs has appeared. My pituitary gland is forming, as are the rest of my brain, muscles, and bones. I have gotten so big, about a quarter of an inch long, about the size of a lentil. Please continue to pray for me and my parents. God has so much planned for me.



Our next session is Sunday, March 22, after the 6 p.m. Mass. Our topic is "Confirmation" chapter 10. The letter to Archbishop Thompson is due.

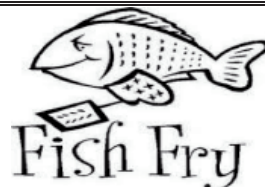
