SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

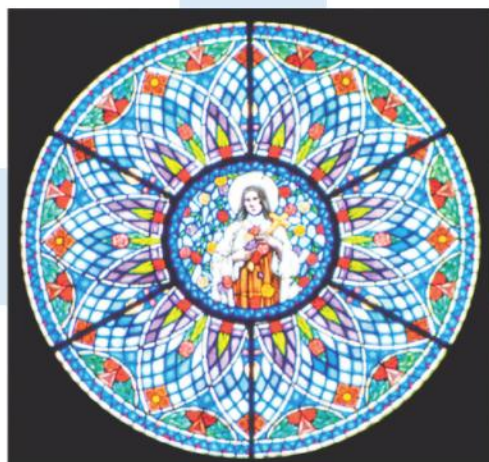

Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, the mid-point of Lent. This might be a good day to review for ourselves how we are doing keeping our Lenten promises. On Easter Sunday, we want to be able to celebrate not only Jesus' resurrection from the dead 2000 years ago but also our own resurrection to new life with him. This will only be possible to the extent that we have put to death the selfishness and sin that is part of our lives in order to rise to new life in Christ.

These are certainly challenging times. There are some similarities and some differences with previous crises. For example, the only time I remember a parish shut down like this was during the Blizzard of 1978. However, the shut down was only for a few days. On the other hand, after 9/11, church attendance increased at least for several weeks. Because of the risk of transmission, church attendance this past weekend was approximately one-half of what it normally is. Now, of course, Masses have been suspended indefinitely.

During this time you are invited to watch or listen to Mass online or on television. While praying or while viewing the Mass on T.V. or online, you are encouraged to make an act of Spiritual Communion. This traditional Church practice is a real source of grace in communion with our Lord. Below is an example of a prayer for Spiritual Communion:

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

You are also encouraged to prayerfully read the readings of Sacred Scripture for the day or to pray the rosary.

The pandemic is taking a toll on everyone physically, emotionally, financially, and spiritually. Throughout the world, large numbers of people are becoming ill and a significant number are dying from this new disease. The constant news reports about the virus are creating a lot of anxiety for a lot of people and panic in some people. Likewise, social distancing is very hard for some people. Financially, this pandemic is hurting the national and local economies. The people for whom I feel most are the people who can least afford not to have income. Likewise, I feel for parents who still have to work and who are now challenged with finding childcare for their children who are suddenly out of school. The pandemic may cause some to question their faith. The perennial question is how God can allow a pandemic that will kill or sicken so many people.

Just the other night I started reading Bruce Scifres' latest book, *True Impact: 25 Short Stories and Insights that Inspire Transformational Leadership*. Bruce Scifres is the Executive Director of CYO. As coach of Roncalli's football team for 20 years, he led them to seven Indiana Football State Championships. Chapter 1 is titled "The Choice Is Ours." In this chapter, he presents Urban Meyer's success equation: $E + R = O$. According to Bruce, E represents events that occur in our lives over which we have no control. R is how we react to the events around this. I would prefer the word *respond*. O represents the eventual outcomes. Certainly we cannot control the coronavirus or the restrictions in our lives because of it, but we can control how we respond to them, which in turn will determine the outcome.

What should our faith response be? In the reading from Genesis two Sundays ago, God said to Abram, "Go forth from the land of your kinsfolk and from your father's house to a land that I will show you....Abram went as the LORD directed him." In other words, God asked Abraham to give up the search for security and to set out on a journey to an unknown land and an unknown future with only God's word of promise to guide him. In other words, God asked Abraham to entrust his life and his future to God and God's word of promise. We are called to do the same. At the same time, we have to do our part. We should remember the words of French philosopher Maurice Blondel: "Once we have done everything as if expecting nothing from God, we still have to expect everything from God as if we had done nothing of ourselves." Part of doing everything we can may be to help those with unexpected needs resulting from the coronavirus.

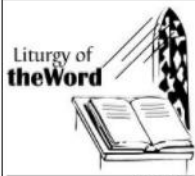

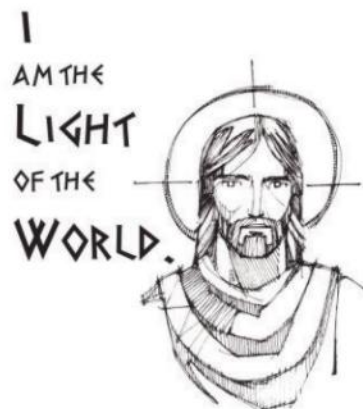

Information sent in an e-mail to parishioners on March 17, 2020:

As you may have already heard on the news, the Archdiocese of Indianapolis has released a statement on the suspension of public celebration of Mass. Based on recommendations from health officials concerning the danger of the COVID-19 pandemic and the urgency to stem the spread of the virus, the five Catholic bishops of Indiana have suspended all Sunday and weekday Masses beginning Wednesday, March 18, until further notice.

The archbishop and some of the priests on his staff will be making online Masses available soon. Please visit the homepage of the archdiocese, www.archindy.org, for more information.

The following is from the communication provided by the Archdiocese:

- Out of an abundance of caution perpetual adoration chapels should remain closed until further notice.
- Decisions about the celebrations during Holy Week and beyond will be made in the coming days.
- As to the celebration of other Sacraments, whenever possible any scheduled celebrations should be postponed until further notice. This includes the celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Matrimony.
- Finally, the celebration of funerals should be postponed whenever possible. If a funeral is offered, then it should be celebrated outside of Mass and in the presence of a very small number of the faithful who practice the prescribed precautions for hygiene and social distancing. A Mass for the intention and the repose of the soul of the deceased may be offered privately by the priest.
- As it pertains specifically to Little Flower parish, the following decisions were made by the parish staff:
 - All remaining Fish Frys have been canceled.
 - Lenten Stations of the Cross and Communion Services have been canceled.
 - Confessions will not be heard until further notice.
 - All parish meetings and gatherings are suspended until further notice.
 - The Parish Office will be closed to the public through at least April 5. During this time you may call the parish office with questions Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon.
 - The Theresean (bulletin) will be sent to parishioners weekly via e-mail, and it will be posted on our website, www.littleflowerparish.org, on a regular basis. You may also check www.discovermass.com for the bulletin. If you know anyone who does NOT have e-mail and would like a copy mailed to their home, please ask them to call the parish office between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon Monday-Friday.
 - Fr. Bob will celebrate Mass privately for scheduled intentions. Check the Theresean for information on intentions.
 - The Church will remain available for personal prayer. If you need the door code for access, please call the parish office.
- We are committed to taking care of our employees during this difficult time. As we are committed to supporting them, we hope you will, as much as possible given your own personal situation, continue to support us. We welcome you to mail your regular Sunday contributions to the parish office, or you may go online to make a contribution using the following link: <http://www.littleflowerparish.org/get-involved-and-give-back/donation-opportunities/>. If you would like to establish automatic contributions, you may do so using the link, or you may fill out the attached form and send to the parish office.
- We will be checking on our elderly parishioners regularly. If you know of a parishioner with needs, please contact the parish office, and we will do our best to help them.

We will continue to update you as new information becomes available. In the meantime, let us continue to pray for those affected by COVID-19, whether it be physically, emotionally, spiritually, or financially.
