

Dear Parish Family,

Thank you to all those who watched the live stream or the recorded version of last Sunday's Mass. At one point, it was noticed that 115 individuals or households were watching the live stream. Also, people were participating. For example, at the Sign of Peace, people were wishing peace to others.

Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. For Christians, and especially for Catholics, Holy Week is the most sacred week of the year. In the earliest days of Christianity, there were no elaborate Holy Week rituals. Instead, the early Christians celebrated Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection in one unified service called the Pascha, i.e., the Christian Passover, or Easter. This was preceded by a short time of fasting in preparation for Easter.

However, already in the 4th century, major changes began in the way Christians celebrated the Paschal mystery of Jesus' dying and rising. The unified Easter Liturgy was split into separate Liturgies that celebrated the principal events of Jesus' final week: his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, the Last Supper, his crucifixion and death, and finally his resurrection. As one might expect, this development began in Jerusalem, where Jesus had spent the last week of his life and where shrines had grown up "on the very sites" where these important events had taken place. Within a short time, however, these services had caught on throughout the Christian world.

There is one way where we at Little Flower do what the ancient Church of Jerusalem did. A European woman named Egeria made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem in 383 and was there for Holy Week. She kept a travel diary. On Palm Sunday, there was a procession in which the bishop "reenacted" the role of Christ while children waved palms. For the last several years here at Little Flower, we have invited our children to process with me carrying palms.

On Palm Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. On Holy Thursday, we celebrate his Last Supper with his disciples during which he instituted the sacraments of Eucharist and Priesthood. On Good Friday, we commemorate his Passion and Death. Finally, on Holy Saturday, we celebrate his triumphant resurrection from the dead and usually celebrate the sacraments of initiation with our Elect. Even if we unable to celebrate together, I think it will be important for all of us to celebrate Holy Week as best as we can.

To help you celebrate Holy Week, we hope to live stream the Holy Week and Easter Liturgies. As I write this, a final decision concerning live streaming Holy Saturday has not been made. Of course, the Liturgies will be very simplified. Our Holy Week and Easter Liturgies will be as follows:

Holy Thursday 7:00 p.m. Holy Saturday if live streamed 8:00 p.m. Good Friday 7:00 p.m. Easter Sunday 9:30 a.m.

The palms that will be blessed on Palm Sunday will be made available when we are able to come together again.

One of the high points of the Good Friday Liturgy is the veneration of the cross. If you watch on Good Friday, I will suggest that at the time of the veneration of the cross, those at home venerate a crucifix or cross you have at home.

Every year during the Easter Vigil we welcome new members into the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation-Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. This year our Elect will not receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil but will have to wait until we are once again able to gather as the People of God. Therefore, I would ask you to pray for them especially during Holy Week, which would have been their final week of preparation. When we are able to celebrate together again, Amber Hudgins, Kinzy Kinser, Jakob Ballesteros, and Preston Ballesteros will receive all three Sacraments of Initiation. Neil Maynard and Diann Lopez have already been baptized Catholic, so they will be confirmed and receive first Eucharist. Finally, Richard Redell will be confirmed.

As I was reflecting on Holy Week and the coronavirus, one Gospel verse kept coming to mind: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" [Lk. 9:23]. What does it mean to take up our cross daily and follow Jesus? It seems to me that many Christians believe they should look for crosses to carry. I would suggest that taking up our cross and following in the footsteps of Jesus means no more or less than dealing well with what life deals us without losing faith or hope and without losing love for others. For each and every one of us, the coronavirus is one of the crosses we are carrying every day.

Finally, I want to especially thank those who are now mailing their Sunday contributions, those who regularly contribute electronically, and those who have made special electronic contributions since the coronavirus crisis began. We depend on your regular contributions to support the parish.






