SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

Today is the Second Sunday of Easter. Traditionally the Second Sunday of Easter was called *Dominica in Albis* or Low Sunday. *Dominica in Albis* means Sunday in White. When the Elect are baptized on Holy Saturday, they are clothed in a white garment. In the early Church, they wore the white garment for a week. On the Sunday after Easter, they went back to wearing regular clothes. The Second Sunday of Easter was also the Octave Day of Easter. Easter Sunday was High Sunday, and its Octave Day was Low Sunday.

Today the Second Sunday of Easter is also called the Sunday of Divine Mercy. Both in the pre-Vatican II Liturgy and today's Liturgy, the Gospel for this Sunday is the Gospel of the institution of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

It seemed to me that our Holy Week and Easter Liturgies could not have been more beautiful. Beautiful Liturgies do not just happen. Special thanks to Mary Martha Costello, Bev Moore, and Steve Clegg who decorated the church. The Easter decorations made the church come alive. As she announced several months ago, after 20+ years, Mary Martha is stepping down as the chairperson of the Arts & Environment Committee.

Also, today once again I want to thank those who have been ministers at our Holy Week and Easter Liturgies:

Special thanks to Mrs. Slaton and the Little Flower 8th Grade Class who celebrated the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, which are posted on our Facebook page and on You Tube. Usually, the 8th Grade Class leads the Living Stations for the parish at 8:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on Good Friday. This has been one of the highlights of 8th grade for many years. This year the 8th grade class told Mrs. Slaton that they wanted to meet online on Good Friday to pray the Stations. Special thanks to Isabella Walters, who read the voice of Mary, and Reanna Hollada, who read the prayers.

Please pray for Lisa Gibbons and her family on the death of her mother, Harriett Hamilton, on Saturday, April 11. As many of you know, Lisa wears many hats at Little Flower. She is responsible for Sunday morning religious education for children who do not attend Little Flower School, children's sacramental preparation for First Communion and First Reconciliation, RCIA, RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children), and Vacation Bible School. She also is the parish bookkeeper and cleans the rectory.

If you have driven past the front of the church, you may have noticed that the cross that was there during Lent and would still be there during the Easter season is not there. A couple of weeks ago, it was removed from the property. I think it was taken as a prank because it was found on top of someone's car in the neighborhood. Therefore, we decided it was best not to display it any more this year. On the flip side, on Holy Saturday, I found a pair of Nike Air men's running shoes and a bicycle lock on the steps to the rectory next to the church. 
