

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGEContact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

Every year the Church honors Mary and seeks her special intercession during the month of May. On Friday, May 1, the bishops of the United States and the bishops of Canada re-consecrated our nations to Mary under the title of Mary, Mother of the Church. In promulgating the Vatican II Constitution *Lumen Gentium* November 21, 1964, St. Paul VI solemnly bestowed upon Mary the title "Mother of the Church." In 2018, Pope Francis added the Memorial of the "Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church" to the universal calendar to be celebrated on the Monday following Pentecost.

On March 25, 2020, Pope Francis wrote a letter to all Catholics asking us to pray the rosary in the home with the family during May. Because of the coronavirus pandemic, he composed two prayers that he invites us to pray at the end of the rosary. If today were not a Sunday, May 3 is the Feast of Sts. Philip and James, two of the twelve apostles. As you may remember, two of the apostles were named James. Traditionally the other James has been referred to as St. James the Greater, and this St. James has been referred to as St. James the Less. St. James the Greater is called the Greater because he followed Christ before this St. James. His feast is July 25. St. James the Less was "the son of Alphaeus" and "the brother of the Lord," i.e., a cousin of Jesus. He was also the leader of the Jerusalem church.

It is interesting that in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the only mention of Philip is in the list of apostles. However, he plays a more significant role in the Gospel of John. John's Gospel recounts the call of Philip and tells us that Philip was from the same town as Peter and Andrew. Philip then leads Nathaniel to Jesus. Before the multiplication of the loaves and fish, Jesus asks Philip where they could buy enough food to feed all the people. Philip responded by telling Jesus that not even 200 days wages would give everyone even a little to eat. In John 12, when some Greeks came up to Philip and asked to see Jesus, Philip told Andrew, and the two of them told Jesus. Finally, Philip was part of the conversation at the Last Supper [14:8-9], opening the way for Jesus to explain the unity of the Father and the Son. According to tradition, Philip preached in Greece, Syria, and Phrygia and was martyred in Hierapolis.

Because of the pandemic, the Little Flower Men's Club will not be able to host its annual Mother's Day Breakfast. To the best of our knowledge, this will be the first time it has not been held in over 70 years. We are truly sorry!

Also, you may have read in last week's Theresean that Summerfest 2020 will not take place May 29-31. We are looking at later dates to hold a scaled-back Summerfest 2020. The money from the festival supports parish and school capital projects that we otherwise could not do.

Finally, thank you for your continued financial generosity to the parish. In addition to your regular contributions, this past week we received several larger contributions from parishioners. I look forward to seeing all of you again soon.


SUMMERFEST 2020 UPDATE
