

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGEContact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

On May 8, Archbishop Thompson announced "the gradual process of reopening our churches and resuming the celebration of the Sacraments publicly." This process includes three phases:

<u>PHASE 1</u> – Reopening churches for private prayer, devotions and the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance *may* begin on *or* after <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>May 13, 2020</u>, respecting the directives of the local authorities of your area. (NOTE: Parishes/communities in Marion and Monroe counties remain under a stay-at-home order at least until May 15, 2020.)

Little Flower will open for private prayer, devotions, and the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Monday, May 18. During this phase, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be by appointment only.

<u>PHASE 2</u> – Public celebrations of Weekday Masses, Weddings and Funerals within Mass, Infant Baptisms, postponed Memorial Masses for those who have died, and the Anointing of the Sick (now even for the seriously ill who may not be in imminent danger of death) *may* resume on *or* after Tuesday, May 19, 2020.

Parishioners will be able to attend weekday Masses beginning on Tuesday, May 19. Please note the times of Masses elsewhere in *The Theresean*. During this phase, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will continue to be by appointment only.

<u>PHASE 3</u> – Public celebrations of Sunday Masses, the Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults, and First Communions *may* resume on *or* after the weekend of May 23 & 24, 2020.

Our regular Sunday Mass schedule will resume on Saturday, May 30, and Sunday, May 31. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available in church from 3:45-4:30 on Saturday.

Although we had hoped to be back the weekend of May 23-24, after consultation with the other Eastside Catholic Community parishes, consideration of all that needs to be completed before reopening for Sunday Masses, and listening to the most recent expert medical advice, we decided to postpone our return to Sunday Masses until the weekend of May 30-31.

The Archbishop's plan made two points very strongly:

Those who are 65 and over and those with high-risk health conditions should remain at home. This is the population that is most vulnerable to the coronavirus. Of course, those who are symptomatic or have tested positive for COVID-19 should not enter a church until released to do so by their health care professional.

The dispensation from the obligation to participate at Mass on Sundays is extended in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis and throughout the State of Indiana until August 15, 2020.

There are several things that have to happen before we reopen. For example, we have to have a detailed plan to maintain social distancing, to clean and sanitize after every service, and to distribute Communion safely. Many guidelines for our reopening are still being developed.

We all will have to do some things differently to do our best to keep each other safe. These guidelines will be made available via parish email, our parish facebook page, and the parish website as soon as they are available. I will ask that you read them thoroughly before coming back into the church for adoration, private prayer, or Mass. Our goal will be to have them ready to send out no later than Sunday, May 17.

If you currently do not receive email messages from the parish, please call the parish office and supply your email address so we can communicate with you in this way.

In the meantime, please be aware that we will ask that you cover your nose and mouth with a mask or other covering and bring your own hand sanitizer for frequent personal use if at all possible. In addition, I cannot emphasize enough that each person and family are responsible to make the best possible decisions for themselves. No one should feel compelled to rush back to church, especially if you are in a high risk age group or have other health concerns that make you move vulnerable. It is very important to us that you stay safe. Therefore, we will continue to live stream the 9:30 a.m. Sunday Mass at least until August 15.

This Thursday, May 21, will be the last day of e-learning for Little Flower School. Therefore, the 9:30 a.m. Mass will be an "all-school" live-streamed Mass. Altar Servers, Eucharistic Ministers, and Lectors

In this rapidly changing environment, our current goal is to return to the celebration of weekend Masses on May 30/31, Pentecost Sunday. There is more information about this decision in Fr. Bob's Theresean letter this week. Because of the recommendations listed below for certain groups recommended to stay home, we will not utilize our current liturgical minister schedule for May 30/31, instead creating a new schedule for May 30 through the month of June. We will not utilize altar servers during this period, and we will need fewer Eucharistic Ministers. Please read this information below from the Archbishop's re-opening plan.

Those who are 65 and over and those with high-risk health conditions should remain at home. This is the population that is most vulnerable to the coronavirus. Of course, those who are symptomatic or have tested positive for COVID-19 should not enter a church until released to do so by their health care professional. The dispensation from the obligation to participate at Mass on Sundays is extended in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis and throughout the State of Indiana until August 15, 2020.

With that information in mind, please let us know as soon as possible if you prefer NOT to be scheduled for the period of May 30 through June 28. If you are willing to be scheduled, but there are certain weekends that you do not want to be scheduled, please let us know that as well. For this schedule only, feel free to send this information to totostello@littleflowerparish.org. Please send this information by May 18. Again, if you are in a high risk group or simply don't feel you will be ready to return to church, just let us know. Thank you for your help!
