Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Several people have asked if we will have the Little Flower Novena this year. It seems to me that we need the novena more this year than in any previous year since I arrived in 2003. This year's Little Flower Novena will begin next Monday, September 21, at 5:30 p.m. Each evening the novena will consist of the novena prayers, a reading, and a Communion Service. The novena will be held Monday through Friday, September 21-25, and Monday through Thursday, September 28 to October 1.

The Solemn Closing of the novena will take place on Thursday, October 1, the Feast of St. Therese. Instead of a Communion Service, the Solemn Closing will end with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Also, on Thursday, October 1, we will celebrate the Feast of St. Therese with Mass at 9:30 a.m. As a parish, we will celebrate her feast at all the Masses on the weekend of October 3-4.

Monday is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This feast originally celebrated the finding of the true cross by St. Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine, in 320 A.D. and the dedication in 335 A.D. of a church built by Constantine over the site of the Holy Sepulcher.

Tuesday is the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. As many of you may remember, for many years, Little Flower parishioners attended Sorrowful Mother novena devotions on Friday evenings at 7:00 p.m.




