you, your love is fin - er than life.

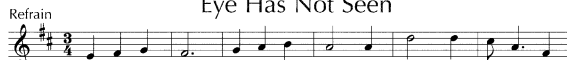
Verses

- I will bless your name all the days I live, I will raise my hands and call on you, my joyful lips shall sing your praise, you alone have filled my hungry soul.

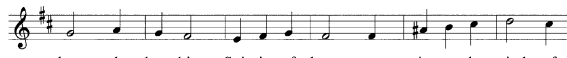
