Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Today we want to pray for all families that they will model themselves after the Holy Family. However, with all the violence in the world, we also want to pray for the human family that we all see ourselves as children of the same God and, therefore, brothers and sisters of one another.

This Friday, January 1, is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Because of the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holydays, the only Mass for the Solemnity will be Thursday, December 31, at 6:00 p.m.

January 1 has also been designated as a Day of Prayer for World Justice and Peace. The theme for Pope Francis' annual World Day of Peace message for 2021 is "The culture of care as a path for peace." Pope Francis wrote, "The culture of care thus calls for a common, supportive and inclusive commitment to protecting and promoting the dignity and good of all, a willingness to show care and compassion, to work for reconciliation and healing, and to advance mutual respect and acceptance. As such, it represents a privileged path to peace."

Of course, January 1 is also New Year's Day.

The parish office will be closed on Friday, January 1.

Finally, the entire parish staff and I want to wish you a blessed New Year. In the Old Testament Book of Numbers [6:24-26], God prescribed the blessing with which Aaron and his descendants would bless the Israelites. This blessing is particularly appropriate at the beginning of the New Year:

The LORD bless you and keep you! The LORD let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you. The LORD look upon you kindly and give you peace!
