Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.



Dear Parish Family,

This weekend we celebrate the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) and RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children) Rite of Acceptance & Welcoming at the 5:00 p.m. Mass. This year we have ten catechumens, one candidate, and two confirmandi. Those who are unbaptized are catechumens; those baptized in other Christian churches are candidates.

In this rite, our catechumens and candidates are asked to publicly declare their intentions to continue their journey towards becoming Catholic and to more fully embrace the Gospel message with God's help. They are signed with the Cross to show that they belong to Christ. Also, in this rite, the parish community more fully participates in and prays for those in the RCIA process. We encourage all parishioners to reach out to them as fellow members of the household of Christ.

Sunday marks the beginning of Catholic Schools Week. This year's theme is *Catholic Schools: Faith. Excellence. Service.*

In lieu of our traditional in-person Open House, this Sunday we are hosting two Virtual Open Houses at 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. This will be a good opportunity to get an introduction to Little Flower Catholic School and meet next year's teachers. Current school families and new families are welcome! The first will be geared to the parents of current students; the second will be geared to the parents of prospective students. 


